Former CJC player drafted by WNBA

Former Chipola basketball player Levys Torres on April 20 became the first Chipola grad to be drafted by the Women's National Basketball Association.

Torres who played for Florida State University her junior and senior years, was picked by the Miami Sol in the third round. She is only the third FSU player to ever be drafted by the WNBA. Her FSU teammate Brooke Wyckoff went in the second round to the Orlando Miracle.

Torres was picked fifth in the third round and 37th overall. As a senior at FSU, she averaged 10.8 points per game and 10.0 rebounds a game and led FSU to the NCAA Tournament. The 6'4 Colombia native was FSU's tallest player where she started all 31 games at center. She averaged 12.7 points per game over the last 14 games of the year and set an FSU record with 24 rebounds against Coppin State.

"I never really thought about realistically playing in the WNBA until this year," said Torres. "During the season I started to see the difference in my level of play compared to last year and I was hoping that this would happen. Whenever anybody asked me what team I would want to play for, I always said Miami. When I found out that Miami had drafted me I couldn't believe it. It is just a great

day for me."

Torres earned third team All ACC honors and was one of the ACC's leading rebounders, ranking third overall. She led the ACC in offensive rebounds (121) and was third in defensive rebounds (189). She shot 54 percent from the field and was third on the team playing 29.9 minutes per contest. She had a career-high five blocks against Iowa State in the NCAA Tournament. She set a new FSU record with 24 rebounds in the Coppin State game and also scored a career-high 24 points in the game. She led the team in rebounding 21 times and had nine double-doubles.

Torres was MVP at Chipola Junior College where she averaged 20.0 points, 15.0 rebounds, 5.0 steals and 3.0 assists in the 1996-97 and 1997-98 seasons. She was CJC's leading rebounder in both her freshman and sophomore years and ranked third on the squad in scoring. She earned first team All-Panhandle Conference honors in 1997-98.

Torres is an information studies major who was named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll. The 23 year-old was born and raised in Colombia, South America where she led the Colombian National Team to the South American Championship title in the summer of 1997.

Seven Indians named to All-Conference Baseball Squad

A total of seven CJC baseball players were selected for the All-Panhandle Conference Team.

Five Chipola players were named First Team All Conference: Ricardo Nanita, Jonathon Swearingen (Marianna), Ivan Naccarata, Jose Bautista and Kyle Olson. Nanita and Bautista were tapped for the exclusive Conference Top Five list. Russell Martin and Lee Potteet garnered Second Team All Conference honors.

Each of Chipola's All-Conference picks rank among the state's top players. Jose Bautista, a sophomore outfielder and relief pitcher, is fourth in homeruns with 13, and twelfth in runs scored with 51. He is also seventh in pitching saves with 5.

Freshman outfielder Ricardo Nanita's .405 batting average is the fifth best in the state. He also is third in doubles with 17. Sophomore second baseman Ivan Naccarata is batting .355, including

nine homers and 46 runs scored. Sophomore short-stop Jonathon Swearingen is hitting .353, with 35 RBI's and 14 stolen bases in 51 games. Sophomore catcher Lee Poteet is batting .328. Kyle Olson is number 12 in pitching with a 7-1 record. Freshman infielder Russell Martin is batting .309 with 43 hits in 51 games.

Chipola captured the Panhandle Conference Championship with a 5-3 win over Okaloosa-Walton April 18 in Niceville. The Indians will play Manatee CC in the first round of the State Tournament in Kissimmee, Wednesday, May 9, at Noon (CST). The Indians finished the regular season ranked third in the state with a 13-7 league record, and 37-14 overall.

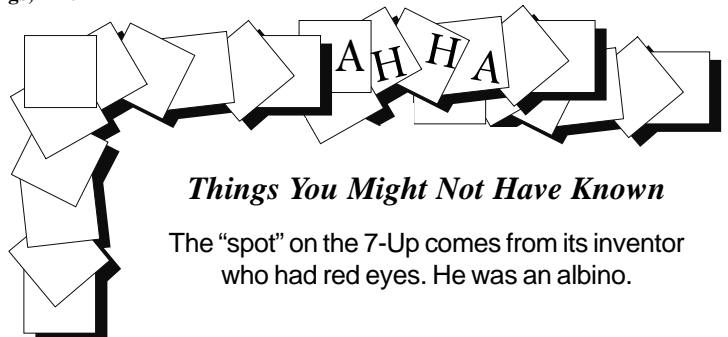
