Chipola Phi Theta Kappa wins International Awards

The Chipola Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa picked up three major awards at the PTK International Convention in Denver, March 29-31.

The Awards honor individual, chapter and region accomplishments in the disciplines of the Society's four Hallmarks: Scholarship, Leadership, Service, and Fellowship.

Andrea Bruner, Chipola's PTK Chapter president, won a Distinguished Chapter President Award based for her leadership, involvement in chapter programs, association with fellow officers and enthusiasm for the Society's Hallmarks. Bruner was one of ten chosen from among 500 applicants for the honor.

Steven Hall, Chipola's PTK vice-president, won a Distinguished Chapter Officer Award for his leadership, involvement in chapter programs, association with fellow scholars and enthusiasm for the Society's Hallmarks. Hall was one of only 25 students chosen from among 500 applicants for the award.

The **Chipola PTK Chapter (Nu Chi)** was named one of the **Top 25 Chapters** in Fellowship in recognition of superior programs in the Hallmark of Fellowship.

Chipola was chosen from among 500 chapters in the category.

Chipola PTK faculty adviser Jody Spooner, says his students were pleasantly surprised by the honors. "Our students did some great work this year with no thought of being recognized. We've got some great people in PTK who recognize the importance of sharing their talents with others."

Chipola's PTK members worked on numerous service projects including Toys for Tots, AIDS Awareness and Water Conservation. Earlier this year, the group sponsored the first-ever Honors Day for High School Juniors on the CJC campus. Phi Theta Kappa is the international honor society for two-year colleges, with more than 1,200 chapters at community, technical and junior colleges in all 50 states, Canada, Germany, Japan and U.S. territories abroad.

The PTK Convention is the largest convention of college students in the nation. Thousands of students gather at the convention every year to listen to exciting speakers, participate in workshops, honor each other's hard work and celebrate membership.

CJC Chamber Chorus to perform at Presbyterian Church

The Chipola Chamber Chorus will present a performance of the "Requiem" by late 19th century, French composer, Gabriel Faure on Tuesday, April 10, at 7:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary of First Presbyterian Church, Marianna (214 N. Jefferson Street).

The "Requiem" is set in the traditional text setting using Latin. In classical music a requiem is a musical memorial service for the dead. French chansons, his "Pavanne," and "Cantique de Jean Racine."

Show Choir members must register for MUN1370 or MUN2371. Scholarships are available and applications are at the time of the audition.

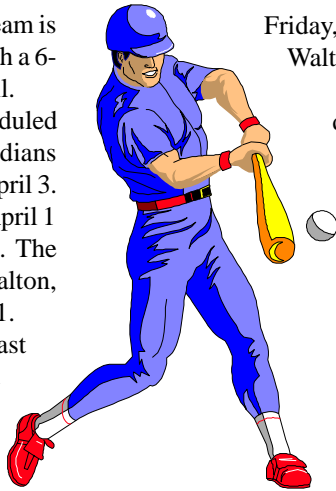

Chipola's road trip to Pensacola scheduled for April 4 was rained out. The Indians whipped Pensacola 7-6 at home on April 3. Chipola outlasted Pensacola 8-6 on April 1 in a makeup of a March 28 rainout. The Indians were swept by Okaloosa-Walton, 4-3 on March 30 and 8-6 on March 31.

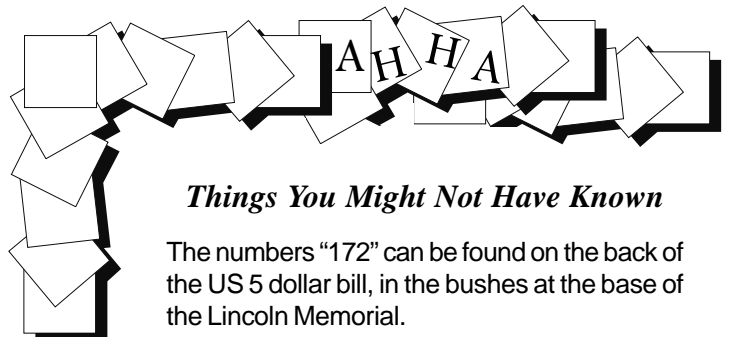
