Late registration continues at Chipola

Fall classes at Chipola Junior College begin Aug. 19, but late registration continues through noon, Friday, Aug. 23.

Applications are available in the CJC Registration office, or online at www.chipola.edu.

Chipola's open-door policy guarantees acceptance to all students with a high school diploma. Testing is required to enroll in certain academic courses.

Chipola offers hundreds of college credit courses during the day and evening, and also through independent study. The college offers the Associate in Arts (AA) degree, a two-year program that guarantees acceptance to Florida's 10 public universities. Chipola also offers several Associate in Science (AS) and Workforce Development programs that provide training for high wage jobs.

Late registration continues through noon, Friday, Aug. 23

Chipola's University Center provides opportunities for students to pursue a number of bachelor's degree and advanced programs on the CJC campus. Florida State University offers a BS in Business Administration and an RN to BS in Nursing (BSN) degree on the CJC campus.

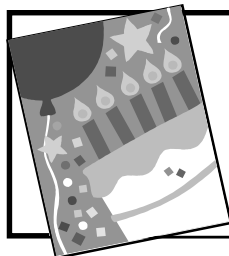

A number of **Child Care** courses will be offered. **Child Growth and Development** will meet Tuesdays, Aug. 20 through Dec. 3, from 6 to 9 p.m. Cost is \$98. **CDA Internship** is set for Aug. 22 through Dec. 5, from 6 to 9 p.m. Cost is \$98. **Early Care and Education Administrative Overview** will meet Thursdays, from 6 to 9 p.m., Aug. 22 through Dec. 5. Cost is \$98. **A 10-Hour Childcare Training** course is set for Aug. 24, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. The course satisfies Part II of requirements in the Childcare Standards, Chapter 10M-12. Cost is \$31. **A 10-Hour Childcare Training Behavior Observation Course** will meet Sept. 7 from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. The course satisfies Part III of the HRS training requirement. Cost is \$31. **A 20-Hour Childcare Training** course is set for Sept. 14 and 21, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. The course satisfies Part I of 30-hour HRS training requirement. Twain’s timeless classic sweeps the audience down the mighty Mississippi as the irrepressible Huck Finn helps his friend Jim, a black slave, escape to freedom at the mouth of the Ohio River. Their adventures along the way are hilarious, suspenseful and heartwarming, bringing to life all of

the favorite characters from the novel – the Widow Douglas and her stern sister, Miss Watson; the uproarious King and Duke, who may or may not be as harmless as they seem; Huck’s partner in crime, Tom Sawyer, and their rowdy gang of pals; Huck’s drunken father, the sinister Pap Finn; the lovely Mary Jane Wilkes and her trusting family.

Propelled by an award winning score from Roger Miller, the king of country music, this jaunty journey provides a brilliantly theatrical celebration of pure Americana. This long-running hit won seven Tonies including Best Musical and Best Score.

“Disney Dazzle” will be the children’s production in set for area elementary schools in May. There will be one public performance on May 15, 2003.

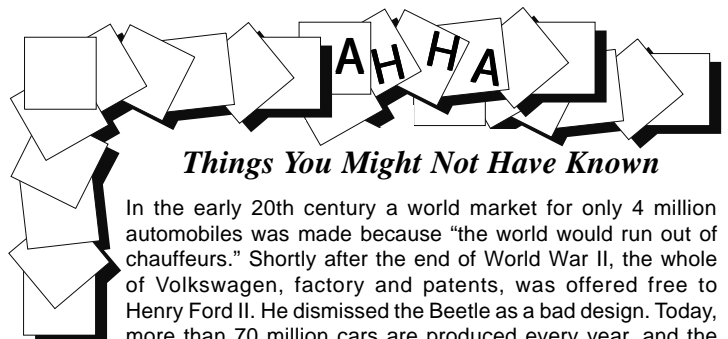

In the early 20th century a world market for only 4 million automobiles was made because "the world would run out of chauffeurs."
