**Chipola Alumni bring national attention to CJC**

It has been a good year in sports for Chipola Junior College alumni. Three men in particular have recently brought national attention to Chipola.

Auburn basketball star, Chris Porter; Auburn head basketball coach, Cliff Ellis, and Arizona Diamondbacks manager, Buck Showalter have all done their part to bring Chipola into the national spotlight.

After finishing the last of his two years at Chipola last year, Chris Porter moved on to Auburn to display his talents against major college competition. Porter burst onto the national sports scene with his electrifying dunks and amazing athleticism. Led by Porter, Auburn amassed its best record (29-4) in the school's history. Porter led Auburn in scoring with 16 points per game, and averaged 8.6 rebounds per game. He also led the team in steals with 64. Porter's popularity among college basketball fans skyrocketed with his label as the "best dunker in all of college basketball." Porter recently announced his plans to remain at Auburn for his senior season, but he still may opt for the NBA.

Another Chipola alumnus who played a significant role in Auburn's success was head coach, Cliff Ellis. In his fifth season with the Tigers, Ellis brought Auburn out of nowhere to their best season ever and a bid for the national title. The Tigers made it to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament before being upset by eventual Final Four team Ohio St. Despite exiting the tournament earlier than expected, it was a banner year for Auburn Hoops. Because of this suc-

cess, Ellis won the John Wooden Award as the best college coach of the year. Ellis said receiving the award was "an honor that holds special meaning" because of my respect and admiration for John Wooden. Ellis won his 400<sup>th</sup> career game this year and was named the SEC coach of the year for a second time.

When former Chipola baseball player, Buck Showalter accepted the job as the manager of the expansion Arizona Diamondbacks, many people considered it a step down from his previous job with the New York Yankees. However, it did give Showalter the opportunity to build a team from scratch and make them a successful franchise.

The Diamondbacks have gotten off to a slow start this year, though they have been competitive. They lost a heartbreaker to the Los Angeles Dodgers in their season opener in extra innings. Arizona seemed to have the game in hand, until a late rally by the Dodgers sent the game into extra innings. In that game, Arizona's first franchise player, Randy Johnson, was acquired through free agency from the Seattle Mariners. Johnson could be the cornerstone of the Diamondbacks future success. Showalter isn't sure how long it will take to make the Diamondbacks a playoff caliber team, he's more concerned with the long-term success of the franchise. Showalter says, "We don't have a timeline. When we get to be successful, we want to be there a long time. We have to set up a great feeder program and that takes time."

**Sophomore Recital at CJC**

## CJC to play final home baseball game Wednesday

The Chipola Indians host North Florida Junior College in the final game of the regular baseball season on Wednesday, April 21, at 6 p.m.

As of April 15, the Indians were 40-11, with an 8-8 conference mark. The Indians were scheduled to play Tallahassee on April 17 and 18. The Indians split a pair with O-W to fall to 8-8 in the conference.

The Indians swept Gulf Coast in a pair of games played April 9 and 10, including a 16-2 win in Panama City. Charlie Dees slapped a two-run homer to give him a total of 22 on the season. Dees broke the long-standing CJC record of 20 earlier this month. CJC whipped OW on April 13.

Leading hitters for Chipola include: Eric

Rankin, .432, with 7 doubles; Charlie Dees, .403, with 13 doubles, 3 triples, 22 homers and 75 RBI's; Drew Miller, .384, with 12 doubles, 13 homers and 39 RBI's; Brennan Dees, .373, with 15 doubles, 15 homers and 43 RBI's; and Cameron Likely .365, with 6 doubles, 5 triples, 29 RBI's and stolen 34 bases.

Justin Lord of Marianna is still Chipola's ace pitcher with a 7-1 mark. Blake Taylor is 8-2 and Buster Drasdo is 8-2. Caleb Crosby has 9 saves on the year, which ties him for a CJC record in that department.

The top two teams in the conference earn a berth to the State Tournament, May 5-8 at Kissimmee's Osceola Stadium.

**CJC professor tapped for international award**

A program developed by Chipola English professor Warren Almand has been selected as one of the top three programs in the Optimist International's Flagship Program.

His program, "Reading for Life," will be presented at the Optimists' International Convention in Toronto in July. Almand and the two other finalists will be provided with a booth and printed materials explaining and promoting their programs in the House of Optimism at the International Convention. Delegates will choose one of the programs as the Flagship Program for Optimist Clubs around the world.

The "Reading for Life" program includes plans for: reading to children in libraries, hosting summer reading contests, and book list contests for pre-schoolers through 12<sup>th</sup> graders.

Almand says, "Although reading is the ba-

sic skill, it has been mastered the least. Studies show that those with the best vocabularies and reading ability do better in all areas of their lives than those with lesser skills."

He points out that his program is not meant to be another literacy program.

"My first desire is to have children get into the reading habit as early in life as possible and to maintain it for their entire life. My second, and even stronger desire, and belief, is that the better they read, the better lives they will have—and, again, for as long as they live."

Almand has taught English and literature courses at Chipola Junior College since 1964. He has been a member of the Optimist Club of Marianna since 1993.
