Nash resigns as CJC Basketball Coach

CJC men's basketball coach and athletic director Carl Nash publicly announced his resignation at a 9:30 a.m. press conference at the college on March 31.

Nash has accepted an assistant coaching position at Georgia Southern University in Statesboro. The Division 1 college is a member of the Southern conference. Nash will join his long-time friend Jeff Price who was named head coach at Georgia Southern on Friday.

During the press conference, Nash said, "I'll miss the people at Chipola the most. Chipola is one of the top programs in the country. This was a very tough decision for me."

Chipola president Dr. Dale O'Daniel said, "Chipola is very proud of what coach Nash has accomplished in our athletic department. In addition to leading Chipola to two state tournaments, he has also led his players to success in the classroom. I believe that coach Nash has helped to write another successful chapter in

Chipola basketball history."

Nash will certainly be remembered for one of his CJC players who has brought national attention to Chipola—Auburn's Chris Porter. As Cliff Ellis' (also a CJC grad) assistant at Auburn, Nash recruited Porter out of high school. The All-American has appeared on the cover of *Sports Illustrated* and *USA Today*, as the SEC player of the year. Porter was CJC's first-ever First Team JUCO All American, and also was named Florida JUCO Player of the Year and two-time Panhandle MVP. He averaged 22.9 points and 11.2 rebounds during his two-year CJC career, scoring a total of 1,332 points in 58 games.

Nash's three-season record at CJC was 59-29. During that time, he coached three consecutive Panhandle Conference MVP's: Chris Porter in 97 and 98, and Clyde Ellis in 99.

O'Daniel said the search for a new head coach would begin immediately.

Requiem set for April 13 performance

The Chipola Chamber Chorus will present a premiere performance of the "Requiem" by British composer, John Rutter, on Tuesday, April 13, at 7:30 p.m., in the Sanctuary of First Presbyterian Church of Marianna.

The "Requiem" is set in the traditional text using Latin and English. In classical music a requiem is a musical memorial service for the dead. Scripture from the Catholic and the Anglican masses are used as well as scripture from Psalm 130 and the well-known Psalm 23.

Nearly every major composer during the last 300 years has written a requiem, most notable of which are the Mozart, Brahms, Faure, and Verdi Requiems. John Rutter, well-known in British

circles as an instrumental writer, has also written extensively for the voice. His "Requiem" was first performed in Dallas, Texas in 1985. Rutter regularly records with the Cambridge Singers and the City of London Sinfonia.

The one-hour presentation, will be conducted by Chipola music instructor Dr. Edward Smith Lyon, and accompanied by Carolyn Wilson, keyboard; Stanley Littleton, organ; Sally Gardner, cello; Allison Borg, flute; Anna Borg, harp; and Phillip Crawford, timpani and bells.

The public is invited to this free and inspirational concert.

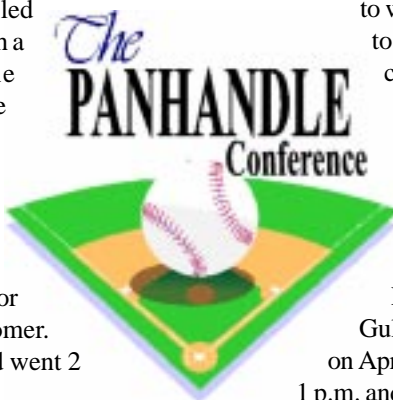

Chipola baseball team still in the Conference race

The Chipola baseball team picked up a big 15-5 win over North Florida on March 31 to improve to 36-9 on the year, and 4-6 in the conference.

The Indians chalked up 9 runs in the fifth to take a 15-1 lead. Charlie Dees led Chipola's offense at 2 for 3 with a three-run homer. With the homerun, Dees set a new single season record at 20. Brother Brennan Dees has 14 homeruns on the season. Other key hitters in the game were Drew Miller with a three-run homer. Jake Mathis was 2 for 3 with a double and a solo homer. Johnny Booth hit a double and went 2 for 3.

Marianna's own Justin Lord picked up his seventh pitching victory of the year to improve to 7-1.



The Indians have split with four of the five teams in the first round of conference play. As of April 1, league records are: PJC (6-2), OW (5-3), TCC (5-4), CJC (4-6), NFL (4-6) and GCC (3-5).

Head coach Jeff Johnson says, "We've got to win a few in a row. We really need to win 8 of the last 10. I know we're capable, but we've got to play much better. We really need to get back to making routine plays."

Chipola has five home and five away games over the next three weeks. The Indians host Pensacola on April 2 at 6 p.m., Gulf Coast on April 9 at 6 p.m., O-W on April 13 at 6 p.m., TCC on April 17 at 1 p.m. and NFL on April 21 at 6 p.m.

The top two teams in the conference earn a berth to the State Tournament, May 5-8 at Kissimmee's Osceola Stadium.

Employee Safety and Health

The following information excerpted from the CJC Safety Manual is published here upon recommendation from the CJC Governance Council. The purpose of this article is to inform students and employees about safety issues.

Chipola employees will not be required to work under unsafe or hazardous conditions nor to perform tasks which endanger their health, safety or well being. Employees will be provided a safe workplace and will be furnished with safety devices, protective clothing and such safeguards as are necessary to reduce or eliminate accidents and injuries. Managers/supervisors will do everything reasonably possible to protect life, health and safety of each employee and the public.

A copy of the *Safety, Health, and Security Manual* will be provided to each employee. Employees are expected to keep the manual in their offices or workplaces and to use it for quick references in case of an emergency. Periodic training sessions will be provided to help employees remain knowledgeable and up-to-date on the latest safety information.

EMPLOYEE RESPONSIBILITIES

Employees will be expected to follow safe practices and operating methods on all jobs as-

signed. Employees shall be required to wear the safety devices, protective clothing or equipment designated by management for employee protection. Safety devices and equipment, where required, will be provided to each employee.

Employees will be required to attend periodic training sessions which are provided at the expense of the College and are scheduled during the employee's work day.

Any employee who refuses or fails to follow safe practices and operating methods will be subject to appropriate disciplinary action, including dismissal.

In the event employees are exposed to infectious diseases or toxic materials as part of their duties, they will be given prescribed examinations and tests at the time of such exposure and thereafter, as determined by the examining physician. Employees will be examined or tested on the College's time and the College's expense. Refusal by an employee to submit to such examinations and tests will be grounds for appropriate discipline, including dismissal.
