Chipola Artist Series announces Millennium season

A Cowboy storyteller, vocalists, a pianist and violinist from Great Britain, and a lawyer named Atticus are starring players in the 1999-2000 Millennium Artist Series at Chipola Junior College, announced today by executive director Joan Stadskev.



The four-event series opens Sept. 21 with **Waddie Mitchell, Buckaroo Poet**, whose cowboy poems and stories come to life on stage. According to Western Horseman, "Waddie Mitchell is probably the most recognized real cowboy in the world today." Mitchell appeared on the Chipola stage nine years ago to a sell-out audience and is being brought back by popular demand.

On Oct. 11 one of the world's musical treasures, **The Scholars of London**, a British unaccompanied vocal quartet will present a sparkling and entertaining performance of music that spans five centuries.

Arriving Feb. 28 is **Double Exposure**, which

combines the talents of two of Great Britain's most sought after musicians, violin virtuosi Thomas Bowes and composer/pianist Eleanor Alberga presenting Baroque, classical, and romantic masterpieces.

The series ends March 30 with a true classic of American literature "**To Kill a Mockingbird.**"

The series is funded through Chipola's Performing Arts Fund, and with grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, the Chipola Regional Arts Association, corporate donors, and through ticket sales.

All performances are at 7 p.m. in the Chipola Theatre. Season tickets go on sale Aug. 30 and are \$40 for all four events. These special season tickets entitle the holders to same seat reserved seats, invitations to the "Meet The Artist" post-performance receptions, subscription to the CRAA arts calendar, and early ticket-renewal next year. A limited number of individual event tickets will be available prior to each performance at the Chipola Book Store at \$12 for adults and \$8 for ages 18 and under. Call 718-2258.

Chautauqua Series coming to Chipola

The American Humorists Chautauqua Series is coming to Chipola for 1999-2000.

Chipola's Chautauqua will feature the characters of Mark Twain, Will Rogers, Langston Hughes, and James Thurber. The dates for the "Morning With..." series of these four one-person shows are **Mark Twain**, November 15; **Will Rogers**, January 31; **Langston Hughes**, March 27, and **James Thurber**, April 17.

Developed by the National Chautauqua Tour, the American Humorist Series debuted in the summer of 1998 in the Great Plains. The Florida tour is being organized by the Florida Humanities Council and comes to Chipola through various funding measures and ticket sales.

According to Joan Stadskev, director of Fine and Performing Arts, Chautauqua (shuh-taw-kwa)

began in 1874 on the banks of Lake Chautauqua in up-state New York and has developed into a thoughtful, educational, entertaining event. Large numbers of people across the nation enjoy the opportunity to interact with historical and literary scholars appearing in costume and speaking in character.

Area citizens as well as Chipola students are invited to enjoy the presentations and take part in the programs. Audience members may ask questions of the historical characters and talk with the scholars when they step out of character to discuss the ideas of their historical figures.

Tickets for each of these four events will be available in the college bookstore beginning Oct. 15. General admission tickets are \$5; and \$2 for 18 and under.
