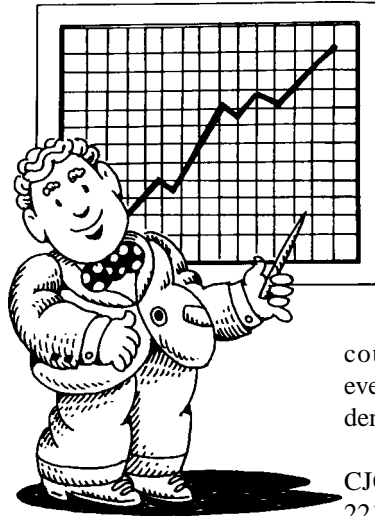
More students at Chipola

CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel says he expects to see more students at the college this Fall.

Approximately two percent more students had registered during the early Fall 1998 registration period compared to Fall 1997. Summer enrollment was also up several percentage points over the previous year.

O'Daniel says, "This is a small increase, but it's still an increase. We're not exactly sure of the reasons for the upswing, but we have tried to do a lot of little things to make college more accessible to our students. The increase is especially encouraging to Chipola at a time when most

institutions around the state are experiencing a downward trend."



New students are encouraged to complete an application prior to the Aug. 5 deadline. Registration for currently-enrolled students will continue on Aug. 19. All students may register Aug. 20 and 21. Fall classes begin Aug. 24.

The college offers hundreds of college credit courses during the day and evening, and also through independent study.

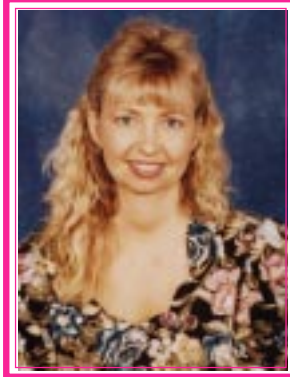

Senior citizens find second career

Local senior citizens are finding their way back into the work force through a special program at Chipola.

A total of 19 seniors completed the Patient Care Assistant program at Chipola during the 1997-98 school year, and most have found employment.

At 84, Eugene Nobles of Blountstown, is the program's oldest graduate. His wife Clara, 76, also completed the course in June. The pair had perfect attendance during the course, and both expect to be employed in the Alzheimer's Unit at Landmark Health Care in Blountstown.

The program is funded by the Department

of Elder Affairs and administered by Green Thumb, Inc. Though the seniors attend classes with students as young as 18, Green Thumb students have graduated at the top of the last three classes. A November 1997 graduate Michael Rodei, now employed at Jackson Hospital, earned a perfect 100 average in the course. Robert Joe was tops in the April class with a perfect average. Virginia Mercy earned a 99 average in the June class. She is now employed as a Certified Nursing Assistant in Stantly, NY.

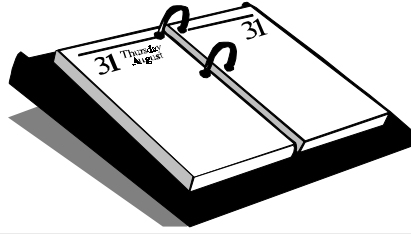
