Chipola offers learning alternatives

Chipola Junior College students will have more choices than ever when scheduling classes this Fall.

In addition to a wide variety of day and evening classes, independent study courses are available for busy students. This Fall, the following 21 courses will be offered in a video tape format: (AMH 2010) American History to 1865, (BSC 1005) Intro to Biological Sciences, (CIS 1941) Internship Computer Science, (CIS 294) Coop Ed-Computer Science, (ECO 2023) Economics II, (ENC 1133) Research Writing, (GEB 1941) Internship In Business, (GEB 2949) Coop



Ed - Business, (GLY 1010) Physical Geology, (HSC 1531) Medical Terminology, (HUN 1201) Elements of Nutrition, (MAC 1105) College Algebra, (MAT 0024) College Prep Algebra, (MAT 1033) Intermediate Algebra, (MGF 1106) Math For Liberal Arts, (NUR 2000C) LPN Transition, (NSP 2094C) Physical Assessment in Health Care, (OST 1941) Internship In Office Technology, (OST 2949) Coop Ed-Office Technology, (PSY 2012) General Psychology, and (SPN 1000) Basic Spanish Conversation.

Two courses will be offered in an online format. ENC 1101 (Communications Skills I) and STA 2023 (Introduction to Statistics)—will be offered via Internet. Bran-

don Vaughn will teach Statistics. Dr. Laurie Culbreth, will teach the Communications course. Culbreth says, "Online courses are not for everyone. Students must possess computer/internet skills and should be able to manage effectively their academic, personal, and/or professional schedules." In the Spring of 2002, Dr. Lou Cleveland is expected to offer EME 2040 (Introduction to Educational Technology) online.

Independent study courses allow students the opportunity to earn college credit without meeting in a classroom, four times per week for sixteen weeks. Students attend an orientation session and learn on their own with textbooks and video tapes. Students must visit campus only a few times for examinations. In online courses, students and instructor interact via Internet, meeting only once every two weeks at the college. A chat room, CD-ROM, and e-mail replace most of the instructor's classroom lectures and group discussions. Written work is e-mailed to the instructor.

Registration for the Fall term is Aug. 16 for returning students, and Aug. 17 and 20 for new students. Students enrolled in independent study and online courses also must attend a distance-learning orientation meeting Aug. 23 at 5 p.m., in Building D-300.

New students planning to enroll at Chipola Junior College in the Fall of 2001 are encouraged to complete the application process prior to the **Aug. 9 deadline**.

Registration for the Fall semester is **Aug. 16** for current students, and **Aug. 17 and 20** for new students. Fall **classes begin Aug. 21**. Late registration will continue through Aug. 27.

Chipola's open-door policy guarantees acceptance to any student with a high school diploma. Applying consists of two easy steps. First, complete an application—available in the Registration Office. Second, provide an official high school or college transcript. Once these steps are completed, accepted students will be assigned an advisor who will provide assistance with registration.

Chipola offers hundreds of day and evening

college credit courses leading to the Associate in Arts Degree. The AA guarantees acceptance to the junior year at Florida's ten public universities. Independent study and online classes also are available.

Chipola's Workforce Development Division offers Associate in Science and Certificate programs which feature open enrollment and self-paced learning. Most Workforce programs offer excellent job placement potential.

A **40-Hour Insurance Pre-Licensing Home Study** course is available for \$295.

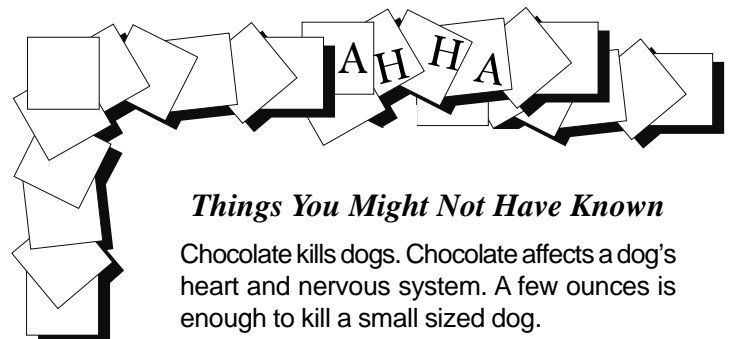
A **Speed Reading** class will be offered. Times and costs will be announced at a later date.
