## Prepare now for Spring Registration at CJC

New students planning to enroll at Chipola Junior College in the Spring 2000 Semester should make application by the Dec. 6 deadline.

Registration for the Spring Semester begins Jan. 3 for returning students and Jan. 4 for new students. Classes begin Jan. 5.

New students must complete an application, provide proof of immunization and provide high school or college transcripts.

## **Chipola ranked third in state**

Chipola Junior College has jumped into the state spotlight after a big week on the hardwood. The Indians are currently ranked third in the state men's basketball poll with a 7-2 record as of Nov. 29.

Three Indians currently are listed among the state's top scorers. Janerio Spurlock is ranked eighth among all scorers with a 21.6 average. Spurlock also was named Honorable Mention Player of the Week. He averaged 25 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.3 assists in Chipola's three games at the Pepsi National Invitational.

Michael Wilder is state's ninth-leading scorer with a 20.9 point average. Lavelle Felton is eleventh with an 18.7 point average. Felton also is the state's number 11 rebounder with a 7.9 average. Kareem Johnson is 15<sup>th</sup> in grabs with a 7.4 average. Lance Buoncristiani is second statewide in assists with a total of 61 in nine games, giving him a 6.8 average.

The Chipola Indians finished second in one of nation's premiere JUCO basketball tournaments last weekend in Ocala. Chipola whipped

Chipola lost a squeaker to top-ranked Aquinas 97-96 in the Nov. 25 championship game. The Indians led by as many as 15 in the first period and went to the lockers with a 47-42 halftime lead, but Aquinas outscored CJC

55-49 in the second half. Chipola was able to tie the score with 12 seconds, but Aquinas hit a free throw to give them a one-point edge. Chipola's Michael Felton took the ball the length of the court, but his four-foot jumper rolled out at the buzzer.

The Indians are scheduled to host Manatee on Nov. 30 at 7:30 p.m. Chipola hosts the Ramada Limited Classic Dec. 1 and 2. CJC plays FCCJ Dec. 1 and Abraham-Baldwin Dec. 2.

Chipola Junior College sophomore infielder **Jonathan Swearingen** of Marianna announced that he had signed with Division 1 University of Mississippi (Ole Miss) during a press conference at Chipola on Nov. 30.

The shortstop hit .326 during his freshman year at CJC. He also hit 14 doubles, two triples, five homeruns and drove in 24 RBI's. Additionally, he stole 12 bases on the season. Swearingen,

who is expected to play shortstop at Ole Miss, also had a .956 fielding average at CJC.

CJC head coach Jeff Johnson says, "We're excited for Jonathan. He's a great kid and Ole Miss has a fine program. Their coach Mike Bianco is expected to bring the program into national prominence in the very near future."

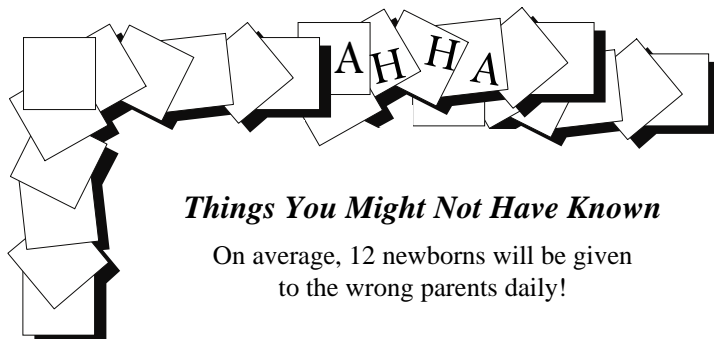
