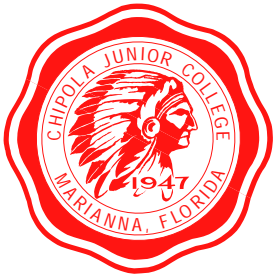

Chipola shines at state FACC convention

Chipola was one of the most talked-about colleges at the Florida Association of Community Colleges Annual Convention, Nov. 17-20, at the Bay Point Marriott in Panama City Beach.

CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel completed his year as state president of FACC, and was successful in bringing the convention to the Panhandle for the first time in FACC's history. The convention set records for attendance at 655, and O'Daniel led FACC membership to an all-time high of 6,509 members.

O'Daniel's executive assistant at Chipola, Joyce Traynom, campaigned successfully for the office of president-elect during the convention. She will serve as state FACC president in the year 2000. Traynom also won the FACC Hero Award for her work as Convention co-chairman, as well as a presidential award for meritorious service. Chipola and Gulf Coast Community College co-hosted the convention.

FACC Chapter president, Sandra Harrell, accepted two awards for Chipola's membership efforts: 50% or Better and Highest Percentage of Membership (181 members).

CJC counselor Joan Miller was selected as a finalist for an Exemplary Practice Award from the Student Development Commission for developing the CJC Advising Manual.

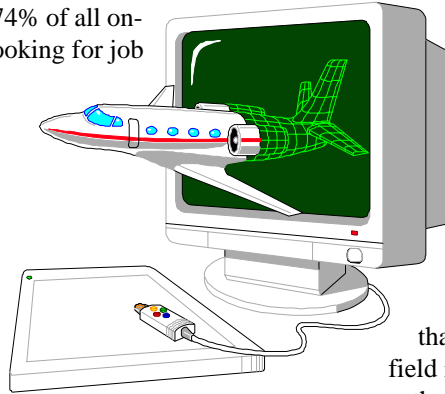

Computer skills need for all fields of study

According to a study conducted by Cornell University, 74% of all on-campus recruiters are looking for job candidates who possess basic computer skills: word processing, spreadsheets, database management and basic graphic design. This is for jobs of any and all types, not just computer-related openings. The message is clear, "if you are not a computer expert when you get to college, use your time



there to become one." Sixty percent of those seeking employment need computer skills and the need for computer skills will continue to increase no matter what your field of study. Right now, today, there are 300,000 unfilled computer-related jobs in this country. In addition, hundreds of thousands new jobs will be added to that number each year. In fact, this field is expected to grow by 70 percent over the next five years.

Chipola to play at home this week

Chipola will host men's and women's basketball games at home this week.

The Lady Indians host Santa Fe Community College on Tuesday, Dec. 8, at 7 p.m. The Indians host Seminole Community College on Saturday, Dec. 12, at 7:30 p.m.

Chipola's men's squad was ranked ninth in the state, with a 6-4 record, as of Dec. 2. The Indians were defeated 62-59 at Alabama Southern on Dec. 1. The team was scheduled to play Daytona Beach at Tallahassee Community College on Dec. 4, and Broward CC in Pensacola on Dec. 5.

The Chipola Indians won both of their games during the Ramada Limited Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 27 and 28. On Nov. 27, Chipola defeated St. John's River 85-64 behind the scoring of **Dennis Cannon** with 15; **Randy Hughes** with 13. **Clyde Ellis** had 11 and **Michael Hardaway** scored 10. Chipola beat Polk 78-67 on Nov. 28. **Randy Hughes** led with 21 points. **Clyde Ellis**

had 17. **Carlos Webb** and **Dennis Cannon** each had 13.

Chipola's women were 7-1 as of Dec. 2. The Lady Indians beat Santa Fe CC 59-39 on Dec. 1. **Sheherah Clark** led with 14 points. **Angela Thornton** had 11. **Mia Taylor** had 10. The team was scheduled to play Delgado in New Orleans on Dec. 5.

The Lady Indians also won both of their games in the Thanksgiving Classic. The Ladies beat Miami Dade 100-77 on Nov. 27. **Keelee Traylor** led with 16. **Tracey Tolbert** scored 15. **Sheherah Clark** had 13. **Angela Thornton** had 12 and **Charrisse Hill** added 11. The game was the Lady Indians' first 100-point game under head coach Hilary Allen.

On Nov. 28, the Lady Indians defeated Delgado 87-67. **Sheherah Clark** and **Angela Thornton** scored 15 apiece. **Mia Taylor** had 14. **Rena Jones** scored 12 and **Shannon O'Connor** added 10.
