Board approves raises for Chipola employees

The CJC District Board of Trustees approved a two percent raise for career and administrative employees during the board's meeting on Jan. 19. The raise is effective July 1, 1998.

The Chipola Faculty Association, the faculty's collective bargaining unit, is currently negotiating its annual contract with the college administration. While the two percent raise has been proposed to the CFA, faculty members must ratify their annual contract to receive the increase.

CJC hosts Gulf Coast on Tuesday

CJC hosts Gulf Coast on Tuesday, Feb. 6 at the Milton Johnson Health Center. The Lady Indians play at 5:30 p.m. The Indians play at 7:30 p.m.

The Indians won a huge upset over Tallahassee on Tuesday by a score of 88-72. Clyde Ellis scored 21 points, Carlos Webb had 17, Dennis Cannon and Michael Hardaway each had 11. Coach Carl Nash says, "We dominated them from tip to buzzer. I'm really proud of them. They played hard, and with a lot of enthusiasm."

The Indians lost their Homecoming match-up against Okaloosa-Walton on Jan. 23. Marcel Davis offered 17 points and Cannon had 15. Davis suffered broken ribs during the game and will be out for two to three games.

The Indians were defeated at home by Pensacola on Jan. 19, by a score of 80-77. "The game was decided at the foul line. Foulshots in the second half really hurt us," said Coach Carl Nash. Ellis put up 25 points toward the effort, with Cannon adding 23. This brings the Indians season record to 11-9 with a conference record of 1-3.

As of Jan. 27, the Men's Conference records are GCC (4-2), TCC (3-2), OW (3-3), PJC (2-3), and CJC (2-4).

The Lady Indians are coming off two heart-breaking defeats against Tallahassee and Okaloosa-Walton.

CJC lost Tuesday night in Tallahassee by a score of 72-65. Leading scorers were Sheherah Clark with 19 points and Angela Thornton with 18.

The Lady Indians also lost their Homecoming game against Okaloosa-Walton on Jan. 23, 79-80. Angela Thornton scored 20 points with 12 rebounds, Sheherah Clark had 18, and Keelee Traylor added 11 points and 22 rebounds.

The Lady Indians logged a conference record win of 89-65 over Pensacola on Jan. 19. Thornton scored 21, Shannon O'Connor and Lacey Tolbert each added 13, and Traylor contributed 12 points and 12 rebounds. The ladies are now 14-8 on the season with a 2-5 conference record.

The Women's Conference records as of Jan. 26 were GCC (7-0), TCC (7-1), OWCC (5-2), PJC (2-5) CJC (2-5), and NFCC (0-8).

The Indians take to the road for the next two games with Pensacola on Feb. 6 and Okaloosa-Walton on Feb. 10. The Indians return home on Feb. 13 against Tallahassee.
