Pianist Frank Weins to perform at Chipola

Concert pianist Frank Weins will appear on the Chipola stage, Tuesday, Feb. 23, at 7 p.m.

The performance will include works by Haydn, Debussy, Liszt and Chopin.

A native of New Haven, CN, Weins studied at the University of Michigan. He has taught at Drake University and, since 1976, at the University of the Pacific where he was recently selected for the Distinguished Faculty Award. He has concertized extensively throughout the U.S. and abroad, with an extensive repertoire of over 30 works.

Weins made his New York debut at Carnegie Recital Hall in 1984. His international performances have included tours of the former Soviet Union and South Korea. He recorded a compact disc featuring the Rachmaninoff Third Concerto with the Slovakia National Orchestra and the

Rachmaninoff Sonata No. 1. The CD was released internationally in 1995. He also has performed with such orchestras as the Atlanta, Denver and Detroit Symphonies.

The Los Angeles Times describes Weins' concert as "A dream, almost hypnotic atmosphere . . . a spellbinding radiance." *The Newport Daily Press* describes a recent performance as "A marvelously beautiful, inspired performance."

Weins' concert is the final event of the 1999 Chipola Artist Series. The program is sponsored in part by local patrons and the Chipola Regional Arts Association.

Traffic warnings now being issued

Did you know that the speed limit on Chipola's campus is 15 MPH? Did you know that the speed limit on College Street is 25 MPH? Did you know that One-Way means one-way? Did you know that it is unlawful to operate a car stereo that can be heard more than 100 feet from the vehicle? If not, this is an important reminder.

Effective immediately, Chipola's Security Officers, contracted from the Jackson County Sheriff's Office, are authorized to issue traffic tickets to CJC students and employees. Officers may issue tickets for the following violations: speeding, illegal parking, driving the wrong way on

one way streets, illegal exits from parking lots, and excessive noise (boom box car stereos).

Warnings are now being issued. Tickets with real fines will be issued beginning March 8. Officers have the discretion to write County tickets which may include several hundred dollars in fines, license points and auto insurance penalties.

Students and employees are reminded that the speed limit on campus is 15 MPH. The speed limit on College Street is 25 MPH.

Failure to pay CJC parking and traffic tickets will result in a hold on registration and access to transcripts.

Indians play double-header Tuesday, Feb. 23

The Chipola Indians host Mississippi Gulf Coast College in a double-header on Tuesday, Feb. 23, at 2 p.m. Chipola hosts Jeff Davis in a single game on Thursday, Feb. 25 at 3 p.m.

The Indians improved their streak to 12 straight by sweeping a pair of wins at Mississippi Gulf Coast on Feb. 17. The Indians took the first game, 5-3, behind winning pitcher Buster Drasdo (3-0). Taylor Crosby threw his fourth save of the season, relieving Drasdo in the seventh. Leading hitters in game one were Keto Anderson, 2 for 4, and Drew Miller, 2 for 4, with an RBI. CJC trailed 2-1 in the sixth, when Anderson hit a two-run single to give the Indians the lead.

In game two, Max Havel relieved Andrew Rush in the third inning, to hold Mississippi scoreless in Chipola's 8-0 win. Havel logged six strikeouts and allowed only two hits in his first win of the season. Anderson was CJC's leading hitter at 2 for 3. Charlie Dees was one for two, including a three-

run homer in sixth. Eric Rankin blasted a solo homer in third to give the Indians a 2-0 lead. Richie Smith was also 2 for 3 in the game.

The Indians also scored a pair of impressive wins over South Georgia on Feb. 14. Blake Taylor was the winning pitcher in game one, a 14-2 win for the Indians. Lane Floyd was 2 for 3 including a grand slam homerun and a two-run double. Brennan Dees was 2 for 3 with a solo homer. Drew Miller was 2 for 2.

In game two on Feb. 14, CJC whipped South Georgia, 10-2, behind winning pitcher Eric Rankin. Cameron Likely was 3 for 4, with four stolen bases. Brennan Dees was 2 for 4.

The Indians' overall record is 12-1. The team was scheduled to host North Lake (Texas) on Thursday, Feb. 18. CJC travels to Lake City on Feb. 21 and to Southern Union on Feb. 22. Conference play begins March 16, when the Indians travel to Pensacola.

State JUCO tourney brings thousand\$ to Marianna

More than 2,000 visitors will converge on Marianna March 3-6 when Chipola hosts the Florida Junior College Men's and Women's State Basketball Tournament.

Chipola Appreciation club president Robert Trammell says, "This is one of the biggest annual events in Marianna. Sixteen teams, with coaches, cheerleaders and hundreds of fans will visit Marianna and contribute a significant amount of money to our local economy."

Ronnie Myers, tournament director, estimates that more than \$250,000 will flow into the local economy during the tournament from food, lodging, recreation and incidental expenses.

CJC Human Resources director Karan Davis, who coordinates motel rooms for the tournament, reports that more than 175 rooms will be reserved for teams and game officials.

Florida Community College Activities Association director Charles Smith says, "Hosting the tournament is a huge undertaking. The Chipola Appreciation Club puts up more than \$18,000 in the form a bid to FCCAA to host the tournament

at Chipola. And there are many other expenses such as insurance, security, scorekeepers and incidentals."

Waste Management is corporate sponsor for the event. District manager Len Necaice recently presented a check for \$10,000 to the Appreciation Club to help fund the event.

Chipola president, Dr. Dale O'Daniel says, "We are very excited about hosting the tournament again this year. And we are very grateful to the many fans and volunteers who contribute to the success of this event."

Dozens of key supporters from the area are working with the Appreciation Club to sell advance tickets for the event. The group met at the college on Feb. 12, to kick off the ticket sales drive. Tournament passes—\$25 for adults and \$15 for students—will get fans into all 14 exciting tournament games. Single session tickets are \$10 each.

Five performances are scheduled in the courtroom of the Jackson County Court House: Saturday, March 13, 7:30 p.m.; Sunday, March 14, 3:00 p.m.; Monday, March 15, at Noon and at 7:30 p.m.; and Tuesday, March 16, at Noon.

Two performances are scheduled in the Chipola Arts Center: Wednesday, March 17, at 11:15 a.m., and Thursday, March 18 at 2 p.m.

According to Joan Stadskev, CJC Director of Fine and Performing Arts, the performances on March 13, 14, and 15 are open to the public. The performances on March 16, 17, and 18 are for specific groups and organizations but CJC students, staff, and faculty may also attend these if their schedules permits.

Gilbert and Sullivan wrote 11 comic operettas including Mikado, Pirates of Penzance and HMS Pinafore. Trial by Jury, a 45-minute operetta, was the first of their projects. The show has delighted audiences for over 100 years, and is well-known as the predecessor of the modern-day "Broadway musical." Set in a British courtroom, a jilted bride sues her fiancé to marry her. The quintessential British humor as depicted by the composers is delightful. Stadskev says, "It's going to be enchanting to watch Trial by Jury in a real courtroom, March 13-16. Mark it on your calendar."
