## Chipola to host Region I Brain Bowl Tournament

Chipola will host the FCCAA Region I Brain Bowl Tournament on Feb. 12 and 13.

Teams from Chipola, North Florida CC, Tallahassee CC, Gulf Coast CC, Okaloosa-Walton CC, and Pensacola JC will compete during the round-robin tournament. Three regular matches are set for Friday afternoon, with two regular matches slated for Saturday morning. The two teams with the best records will play in the Championship Match on Saturday morning. These two teams will advance to the State Tournament that will be held March 28-30, in Panama City.

The Championship match will determine which teams will earn the number one and number two seeds from Region I for the State Tournament.

Chipola offers self-paced, open-enrollment Business courses. Document Processing I (OST 1102) and Document Processing II (OST 1112)

meet during the day. Both day and evening classes are available for Keyboarding Skills (OST 1141), Shorthand Diction/Transcription (OST 1212), Office Practice (OST 2402), and Machine Transcription (OST 1601). **Pianist Frank Weins to perform at Chipola**

Concert pianist Frank Weins will appear on the Chipola stage, Tuesday, Feb. 23, at 7 p.m.

The performance will include works by Haydn, Debussy, Liszt and Chopin.

A native of New Haven, CN, Weins studied at the University of Michigan. He has taught at Drake University and, since 1976, at the University of the Pacific where he was recently selected for the Distinguished Faculty Award. He has concertized extensively throughout the U.S. and abroad, with a repertoire of over 30 works.

Weins made his New York debut at Carnegie Recital Hall in 1984. His international performances have included tours of the former Soviet Union and South Korea. He recorded a compact disc featuring the Rachmaninoff Third Concerto with the Slovakia National Orchestra and the

Rachmaninoff Sonata No. 1. The CD was released internationally in 1995. He also has performed with such orchestras as the Atlanta, Denver and Detroit Symphonies.

*The Los Angeles Times* describes Weins' concert as "A dream, almost hypnotic atmosphere . . . a spellbinding radiance." *The Newport Daily Press* describes a recent performance as "A marvelously beautiful, inspired performance."

Weins' concert is the final event of the 1999 Chipola Artist Series. The program is sponsored in part by local patrons and the Chipola Regional Arts Association.

## Chipola hosts Tallahassee on Saturday, Feb. 13

Chipola hosts Tallahassee in a pair of games on Saturday, Feb. 13, at the Milton Johnson Health Center. The Lady Indians play at 5:30 p.m. The Indians play at 7:30 p.m.

Both Chipola teams recorded big upsets over Gulf Coast on Tuesday, Feb. 2. The Lady Indians toppled the Lady Commodores in overtime, 93-89. Charisse Hill of Marianna was the leading scorer with 18. Shehera Clark had 17. Keelee Traylor and Angela Thornton each scored 16. Mia Taylor scored 11, and Shannon O'Connor added 10. With a 16-8 overall record and a 4-5 conference mark, the Lady Indians are still in contention for a state tournament berth.

The Indians also scored a big 106-94 upset over Gulf Coast on Feb. 2. Dennis Cannon led Chipola with 27 points. Clyde Ellis scored 21.

Carlos Webb had 20 and Rudy Williams added 13. Head coach Carl Nash says, "Everyone that played, scored. We had an outstanding effort beating TCC, then coming back and beating number two Gulf Coast. We're right back in the race, only one game out. We played a 40-minute game." The Indians scored a huge 88-72 upset over top-ranked Tallahassee on Jan. 26. Clyde Ellis scored 21 points, Carlos Webb had 17, Dennis Cannon and Michael Hardaway each had 11.

The pair of recent wins keeps the Indians in contention for a state tournament berth. With five conference games remaining, all five men's teams are still in the hunt. As of Feb. 3, the Men's Conference records are GCC (4-4), TCC (4-3), OW (4-3), PJC (3-4), and CJC (3-4).

## Chipola opens baseball season

The CJC baseball team has a full slate of home games on tap this week. The Indians host Southern Union in a single game on Tuesday, Feb. 9 at 2 p.m. Chipola hosts doubleheaders with George Wallace on Saturday, Feb. 13, at 2 p.m. and South Georgia on Sunday, Feb. 14, at 1 p.m.

Chipola opened its regular season at home on Thursday, Feb. 4, game against Lake City Community College. The Indians were scheduled to play at South Georgia on Feb. 5, and to host Darton in a doubleheader on Sunday, Feb. 7.

Chipola is coming off an impressive 41-17 season and a third place finish in the 1998 state tournament. Last year's team was dominated by sophomores, 11 of which are now playing at four-year institutions. With only two returning starters and just six returning players from the 1998 team, head coach Jeff Johnson says this year's team will have a new look. The Indians have 15 newcomers that will try to replace the talent that left after last season. Chipola's returning players are led by Charlie Dees and Cameron Likely. Dees hit .368, with 17 HR's and 68 RBI's, and was a first team All Panhandle Conference and first team All-State designated hitter in 1998. Likely was an outstanding leadoff hitter who batted .311 and stole 24 bases. He also was an excellent defensive centerfielder. Also returning, are pitcher/outfielder Eric Rankin and speedy outfielder Johnny Booth, who are expected to make big contributions this year. The Indians lost their top five pitchers: Matt Steele (University of Georgia), Phillip Sledge (University of Georgia), Ben

Saxon (Louisiana State University), Brad Weis (Auburn University) and Tranum McLemore (University of Auburn at Montgomery) after the 1998 season. This year's team will rely heavily on a freshman group of pitchers to earn the Indians their third consecutive trip to the JUCO State Tournament in as many tries under Johnson.

Rankin is the only returning pitcher from a year ago and he pitched only 17 innings with a 4.86 ERA. Newcomers Nathan Marks, Peyton LeCuyer, Travis Crouse, Ryan Smith, Blake Taylor, Justin Lord (Marianna High), Caleb Crosby, Buster Drasdo, and Max Havel are some of the incoming pitchers who will be expected to step up early during the season.

Offensively, the Indians should be solid with the addition of junior college transfers such as outfielder Brennan Dees and catcher Lane Floyd. Along with a freshman recruiting class of Drew Miller, Richie Smith, Keto Anderson, Jake Mathis (Marianna High), Michael Brown, Fernando Isa, and Moises Feliz, the Indians should have one of their best offensive teams under Coach Johnson.

Johnson is hopeful that his newcomers will fill the void left by last year's key players: Grant Conyers (Jacksonville University), Juan Bonilla (Baltimore Organization), Luc Riopel (Winthrop University), David Credeur (Florida International University), Des Baxter (University of New Orleans), Michael Mitchell (Faulkner University), and Brent Fowler (University of West Georgia). All seven signed scholarships with four-year universities.

**CFA ratifies contract**

The Chipola Faculty Association ratified the faculty's annual contract at a meeting on Tuesday, Feb. 2. In addition to a two percent raise, the CFA also successfully bargained for a two-day reduction in faculty workload from 200 to 188 days. The new contract also provides for direct electronic deposits of payroll checks by the end of 1999. The administration also agreed that faculty overload payments will be itemized clearly on regular pay checks. Faculty parking was the subject of the last item, which states, "The employer will insure that all faculty parking places will be as close or closer than what they currently have as of Fall, 1998."
