Education mini-course offered

Chipola will offer a special condensed sec-
tion of Introduction to Education (EDF 1005),
beginning Feb. 2.

A required course for education majors in
Florida, the class will include a study of the prin-
ciples, historical views, curriculum, pupil popu-
lation, educative processes, and teaching as a
profession.

According to CJC Dean Dr. Kitty Myers, the
course is being offered in a condensed timeframe
of six weeks, rather than the usual 15-week se-
mester. The course will meet Tuesday and Thurs-
day evenings from 5 to 9 p.m., from Feb. 2 to
March 11. Myers says, "We hope that this course

will be valuable for Chipola students and others
who choose to take advantage of this unique
format."

Robert Ivey, history and education instruc-
tor, will teach the course. With more than two
decades of experience as a K-12 and a college
instructor, Ivey will offer a unique perspective
on the subject.

Big week of basketball at Chipola

Chipola has huge week of basketball action with four home games on tap in Johnson Health Center.

CJC hosts Pensacola Junior College in a pair of home games on Tuesday, Jan. 19. The Lady Indians play at 5:30 p.m. The Indians play at 7:30 p.m.

Chipola's Homecoming Games against O-W are Saturday, Jan. 23, at 5:30 and 7:30. The 1999 CJC Homecoming Queen will be crowned during halftime of the men's game.

The Lady Indians are fresh from a 78-58 win over North Florida on Wednesday Jan. 13 in Madison. Sherise Hill of Marianna High led Chipola with 14 points. Sheherah Clark of Graceville High scored 13, and S h a n n o n

O'Connor added 10. As of Jan. 14, the Lady Indians were 1-2 in the conference with a 13-5 overall record.

Chipola lost to Tallahassee in a pair of home games on Saturday, Jan. 9. The Lady Indians fell to the Lady Eagles, 70-76.

The Indians also lost to Tallahassee, 99-86. Clyde Ellis led Chipola with 24 points. Anthony

Brown scored 15, and Rudy Williams had 13. Tallahassee took control before halftime and led by as many as 21 points in the second half. CJC head coach Carl Nash says, "We played hard, especially at the end of the game, but we just couldn't make up the difference. They hit some good open threes and we didn't contest their shooters. We'll bounce back from this. Our kids can play up to their level; we'll just have to be better prepared the next time we play them." As of Jan. 14, the Indians are 1-1 in the Conference with an 11-7 overall mark.

As of Jan. 14, Men's Conference records are: GCC (3-0), TCC (1-1), CJC (1-1), PJC (1-1) and OW (0-3).

Chipola forward Clyde Ellis was selected the Florida Community College Activities Association Player of the Week. The

sophomore averaged 23 points and 8 rebounds in Chipola's 78-75 win over O-W on Jan. 6, and Chipola's 99-86 loss to TCC on Jan. 9. Ellis, a 6'6, 220 pound product of Brooklyn, NY, was an All-State pick at New York's Abraham Lincoln High.

Both CJC teams were scheduled to play at Gulf Coast on Saturday, Jan. 16.
