## Chipola hoops squads ready for conference play

The Chipola men's and women's basketball squads jump into conference action next week.

**The Lady Indians** open at North Florida on Jan. 10. Both squads travel to Gulf Coast on Jan. 13. Both Chipola teams open conference play at home Wednesday, Jan. 17, with Pensacola.

**The Lady Indians** improved to 9-6 with a 79-76 overtime win at Seminole CC on Jan. 3. Tasha Mathis led Chipola with 18. Satoya Spates and Sowoy Varney had 17 apiece. Takesha Oden pulled in 9 rebounds and made two free throws late in the game to give the Lady Indians the three point edge. Chipola suffered a 61-57 loss to Central Florida CC on Jan. 2.

Chipola's women scored a 75-67 win over Wallace @ Hanceville on Dec. 12. Spates scored 14. Mathis hit 12. Shay Young added 11. CJC defeated Brevard 68-49 on Dec. 9. Varney led CJC

with 17. Ashley Whitson had 10.

Satoya Spates was named FCCAA Honorable Mention Player of the Week for Nov. 27-Dec. 4. Spates averaged 21 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.3 assists, and 1.3 steals per game during the week.

**Chipola's men's squad** plays a pair of road games at Meridian, Jan. 6 and at Santa Fe, Jan. 9, before opening the conference season Jan. 13 at Gulf Coast. The men improved to 14-2 with four straight road wins before the Christmas break. Chipola whipped St. John's River 106-94 on Dec. 16. Wayne Bransom led Chipola with a career-high 26 points. Lavelle Felton scored 18. Janerio Spurlock poured in 15.

Chipola remains third in the state poll behind top-ranked Okaloosa-Walton and number two Tallahassee. The Indians are number 22 in the national JUCO poll.

## Stadsklev appointed to state folk arts panel

Joan Stadsklev, Director of Fine and Performing Arts programs at Chipola Junior College, has been selected to serve on the Folk Arts Panel of the Florida Division of Cultural Affairs, Florida Department of State. The panel awards grants for Folk Arts projects to applicants from across Florida.

In her work at Chipola, Stadsklev administers the disciplines of music, visual art, and theatre arts, which includes oversight of faculty, students and programming. Additionally, she chairs the scholarship committee for the three areas, advises students and writes grants.

In 1987 the Southern Arts Federation designated Chipola as a Rural and Minority Arts Regional Initiative. Through that designation,

Stadsklev visited folk arts programming initiatives throughout the Southeast. Additionally, the college was the recipient of a grant to survey folk arts in Chipola's five county district. That survey led to folk arts festivals on the Chipola campus and subsequently to the strengthening of folk arts programming in various organizations in those counties.

Stadsklev has previously served on the Florida Folk Arts Panel, and has attended several meetings of the Florida Folklife Festival. In 2000, Chipola received a grant from the Florida Bureau of Historic Preservation for a Florida Panhandle Folklife Survey. The college continues to serve as a resource for folk arts and other art forms.
