Porter is Chipola's First NBA Pick

Chris Porter became the first Chipola Junior College basketball player to be drafted by the NBA when he was picked by the Golden State Warriors in the June 28 NBA Draft.

Porter, who played his junior and senior years at **Auburn** University, was the number 55 pick in the second round. As a junior, Porter was second-Team All-American, SEC Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year, and led Auburn in scoring (16) per game, rebounding (8.6) and steals

(2.1). He led the Tigers to the 1999 Sweet

16. As a senior, he led the Tigers in scoring, averaging 14.6 a game, and was named Second Team All-SEC.

Porter played his freshman and sopho-

more years at Chipola Junior College in Marianna where he played for Carl Nash—a former Auburn assistant. Porter became the first CJC player to have his number (#34) retired. He also was Chipola's firstever first-Team All-Ameri-

can. He averaged 22.3 points per game as a freshman and 24.4 as a sophomore. Porter led Abbeville High School to Alabama's 4A State title.
