Chipola to offer Forest Technology Program

Chipola will offer a Forest Technology Program through distance learning beginning August 23.

Through a partnership with Pensacola Junior College, Chipola will offer the program through a combination of traditional television courses on the CJC campus, night classes on the PJC Milton campus, and an extended (3-4) week summer camp.

The Forestry program prepares students for careers as forest technicians by providing hands-on training and an understanding of the many disciplines of forestry. Instruction



by working foresters, field experience, and exposure to the forest industry will prepare students to seek employment with forest industries, state and federal agencies, and forestry consultants. Students may choose from two areas of specialization: Forest Management or Wood Procurement. A field experience at Blackwater River Forest Environmental Training Center is required during the summer term.
