Prepare now for Fall registration at Chipola

New students planning to enroll at Chipola Junior College in the Fall of 2000 are encouraged to complete the application process prior to the **Aug. 8 deadline**.

Registration for the Fall semester begins **Aug. 17** for current students and **Aug. 18 and 21** for new students. **Fall classes begin Aug. 22.** Late registration will continue through Aug. 28.

Applying consists of three easy steps. First, complete an application—available in the Registration Office. Second, provide an official high school or college transcript. And third, provide proof of measles immunization. Once these steps are com-

pleted, accepted students will be assigned an advisor who will provide assistance with registration.

Chipola offers hundreds of college credit courses leading to the Associate in

Arts Degree. Courses are available during day and evening, and also through independent study. Chipola's Workforce Di-

vision offers Associate in Science and Certificate programs which feature open enrollment and self-paced learning. Most Workforce programs offer excellent job placement potential.

Lady Indians add pair of top players

Chipola Lady Indians basketball coach Jason Keene recently signed a pair of top players.

Clouttia Young, a 6'0 player from Cleveland's Shaw High School played on one of the top teams in Ohio under legendary coach Edith Spivey. Keene says, "Young is very skilled with the ball. She has good feet and hands. We are very fortunate to get such a great player this late in the year."

Sowo Varney, 5'10, from Woodrow Wilson High in Long Beach, CA, originally signed with the University of New Orleans. Keene says, "Varney is strong and athletic with a tough defensive game. She is a little undersized for her position, but she will be an asset to our team."

The latest recruits join a host of area players that Keene signed shortly after taking the CJC job in May. They include: **Cassie Bates, a 5'10** wing

player from **Blountstown** High, who averaged 21 points, 9.5 rebounds senior year and was a Tallahassee Democrat All Big Bend selection; **Kamika Collins, a 5'6** point guard from Telfair County High in McRae, GA, who averaged 19 points, 4 assists, 3 steals and won Honorable Mention All State honors; **Takesha Oden a 6'3** post player from Sylacauga, AL, who averaged 17 points, 8 rebounds, 2 blocks; **Grand Ridge** graduate **D'Leisha Cockerham** who averaged 20 points and 5.7 rebounds; and **Malone** graduates **Satoya Spates** and **Temecca Barnes**, who both led Malone to a 27-5 mark and earned All State and Big Bend honors.

Keene says he has one more scholarship to fill and is reportedly waiting to hear from some other Division 1 signees concerning test scores.

Bookstore seeks help

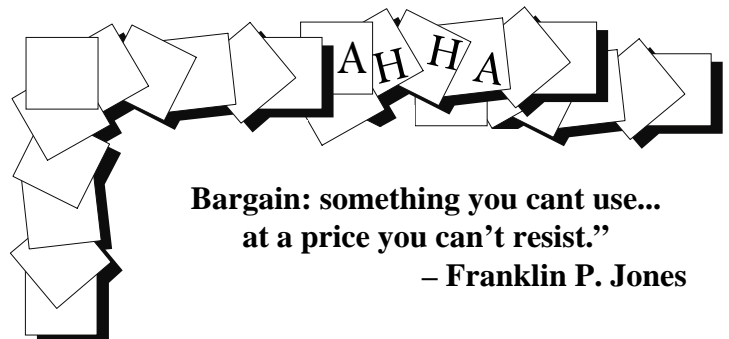
The bookstore will be hiring temporary help during the fall rush. If you are interested in working please come by and fill out an application. If you have a parent interested in working during this
