Chipola Appreciation hopeful for state tourney bid

CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel announced this week that Charles Smith, Administrative Coordinator of FCCAA, was in Marianna July 13 to discuss the Chipola Appreciation Club's bid to secure the men's and women's state JUCO basketball tournaments for the next four years.

Director Smith met with Chipola officials, members of the Chipola Appreciation Club, and other community leaders as he checked out the Johnson Health Center and other facilities at the college. He also reviewed information on motel accommodations, as well as recreational and related facilities. Smith stated, "Chipola has hosted the tournament on a year-to-year basis for the last three years, and the tournament has grown each year. However, the tournament will now be awarded for a four-year period. There are several other viable applicants, all of which are located in larger areas."

Smith had asked to meet with the Chipola Appreciation Club once more to assess their bid before a final decision is made in early August.

Chipola Executive Vice President and past tournament administrator Gene Prough indicated that the tournament has been a boon to local commerce. He says, "In speaking with many of the motel and restaurant owners, and other business people in the area, they reported a dramatic increase in business during tournament week. We don't know exactly how much money is spent in our community by the sixteen teams, their coaches and fans, but we estimate that hundreds of thousands of dollars flow into our local economy."

Chipola Appreciation Club President Robert Trammell said, "I am glad that Chipola is on the tournament committee's short list. Our Appreciation Club, the college, and the community have been very supportive of the tournament, and I believe that we are the logical choice to host the event. We are going to try to convince Mr. Smith of that when we have our final meeting with him in a couple of weeks."
