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### Local teachers participate in STW Internship program

Some 42 area public school teachers and businesses participated in a Teacher Internship Program this Summer sponsored by the Chipola Junior College School-to-Work and Tech Prep programs.

Teachers submitted proposals to participate. Six teachers were selected for two-week internships, and the rest for one-week internships.

Participating businesses allowed teachers to work on their job site at no cost. Teachers were paid through the federally funded School-to-Work/Tech Prep grant.

Judy Riviere, School-to-Work/Tech Prep Manager says, "Employers received a service from teachers, and the experience helped teachers develop partnerships for their classrooms and schools. Additionally, teachers gained a better understanding of school-to-work transitions by assuming the role of student rather than teacher. We believe that the program will help teachers integrate real-world work experiences into classroom activities."

Riviere said feedback from the teachers indicates that the internship program has been a very rewarding experience for teachers, as well as the business partners. "So many of our teachers go straight from college to the classroom, and never have the experience of working in a business. It has been very rewarding to read the portfolios of each participant. You can almost

feel the excitement of the teachers. This has been a great program for teachers and well as our business partners. The positive benefits for students, though, is what it is all about."

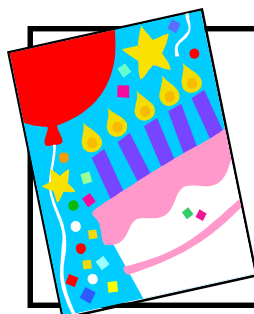

**Chipola announces fall application deadline**

New students planning to enroll at Chipola Junior College in the Fall of 2000 are encouraged to complete the application process prior to the **Aug. 8 deadline**.

Registration for the Fall semester begins **Aug. 17** for current students. New and returning students may register on **Aug. 18** and **Aug. 21**. Fall **classes begin Aug. 22**. Late registration will continue through Aug. 28.

Applying consists of three easy steps. First, complete an application—available in the Registration Office; second, provide an official high school or college transcript; and third, provide proof of

measles immunization. Once these steps are completed, accepted students will be assigned an advisor who will provide assistance with registration. Chipola offers hundreds of college credit courses leading to the Associate in Arts Degree. Courses are available during day and evening, and also through independent study. Chipola's Workforce Division offers Associate in Science and Certificate programs which feature open enrollment and self-paced learning. Most Workforce programs offer excellent job placement potential.

FSU is offering a Bachelor's Degree in Nursing (BSN) for Registered Nurses. FSU liaison Kimberly Amos-Tata will advise, admit, and register all interested students. Chipola personnel will also be available to advise students about community college matters.

All of the BSN courses will be taught on

Chipola's campus or over the Internet. Computer training will be provided and students will have access to Chipola's computers. FSU has hired a coordinator who will be based at Chipola to assist students in this program.

**Bookstore seeks help**

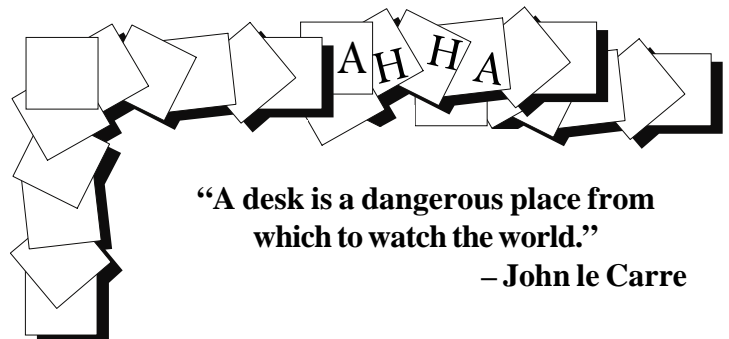
The bookstore will be hiring temporary help during the fall rush. If you are interested in working please come by and fill out an application. If you have a parent interested in working during this
