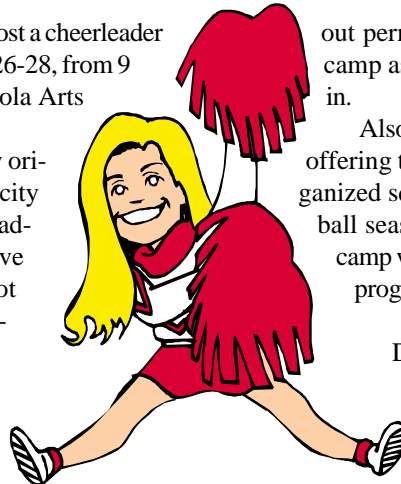

**Kids' College returns for second session**

Chipola will offer its second session of Kids' College June 21-July 1. The camp has morning camps from 9 a.m. to Noon and afternoon camps from 1-4 p.m.

Participants may choose from six morning camps: Camping/Hiking; Computer Camp; Performing Arts Camp; Science Camp; Sports Camp; and Swim, Sun and Safety Camp. Students may choose two from the following afternoon classes: Animal Balloons/Clown Make-up and Face Painting; Around the World in Eight Days; Art; Baseball Cards and Chess; Christmas in June and July; Clay Creations and Origami; Computers/Introduc-

tion; The Internet; Country Line Dancing; Crafty Creations; Jazz; Jewelry Making; Kids in the Kitchen; Let's Play Ball; Magic; Memory Makers; Miss Manners; Music in Motion; Rocketry I; Rocketry II; T-shirt Magic; Treasure Hunt on Pirate's Cove; Whodunnit?; Zig Zag and Pop-up Books.

**Criminal Justice Training slated at Chipola**

The CJC Criminal Justice Training Center is offering a number of basic and advanced training opportunities for Corrections and Law Enforcement personnel.

Application deadline is July 15 for the Basic Corrections Day Academy that begins August 2.


A 16-hour Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Instructor Trainer Course will be held June 17-18, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. This course is recommended for all personnel who are required to use SCBA equipment. This course is free for Florida Law Enforcement Officers, and \$105 for non-Florida residents.

An 8-hour Advanced Management Practices course will be held June 24, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. This course is recommended for Corrections and

Law Enforcement personnel in supervisory positions. Course topics will include: the job in the environment; blend of rights and duties; interpersonal roles; authority, power and conflict; decision making; and personality inventory. Tuition is \$45 for Florida residents.

A 4-hour Conflict Resolution course will be held June 29, from 8 a.m. to Noon. This course is recommended for supervisors and managers. Topics will include: causes of conflict; conflict in the workplace; effective responses to conflict; and mediation skills. Tuition is \$35 for Florida residents.
