The month of June also saw a pair of grandchildren added to the Chipola family.

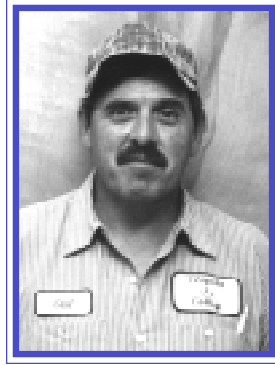

## Board approves budget and evaluates president

The Chipola District Board of Trustees approved the 1998-99 college budget and evaluated the college president during the board meeting on June 16.

The \$9.5 million budget is up 5.3 percent from last year, and includes the following new positions: culinary arts instructor, assessment center manager, independent study/distance learning director, grants accountant and up to four custodians. Some \$250,000 is earmarked for operating costs for the new Public Service and English buildings. The spending plan also provides for a six percent reserve fund which includes a four percent holdback required by state law and an additional two percent contingency required by the CJC board.

In order to fund the budget, the Florida Legislature approved an overall seven percent increase in student fees. The increase will cost a full-time academic student around \$55 more per semester. Chipola president Dr. Dale O'Daniel said, "We make every effort to hold down costs, but because tuition in Florida is low, a state goal is to have students pay a greater share of the cost of education. Our fees remain well within the state average and I believe that we offer a high quality education at a reasonable cost."

The college receives 78 percent of its revenues from the state, 18 percent from student fees and four percent from other sources such as interest income. The college spends 78.6 percent on personnel, 19.5 percent on current expenses and 1.8 percent on capital outlay. O'Daniel says,

"This budget reflects our emphasis on people. Because the students are our focus, we spend the vast majority of our budget on teaching them. We are proud that Chipola has the highest ratio of full-time faculty to total employees of any of the 28 community colleges."

In other business, trustees presented the annual evaluation of the college president which measured his effectiveness in five areas. Six board members reported the highest possible overall rating of "excellent." One member rated the president as "good." Trustees also added the following comments: "Dr. O'Daniel is doing an excellent job. . . our college has made great strides forward during his tenure. . . It's great to have Dr. O'Daniel on our team. He has put together an excellent staff." No areas of needed improvement were noted on the evaluation.

O'Daniel was hired as president of the college in May of 1995. Trustees approved a two-year renewable contract in 1996. A committee was appointed to meet with O'Daniel to discuss annual items in his contract.

The board also approved a personnel agenda which includes the appointments of Gina Johnson, Business Instructor; Judy Barber, Tara Crumpler, Lisa Fowler and Lori Harris in the One Stop Center; and the resignation of Adena Moree, theater instructor. Three employees—Dr. Dale O'Daniel, Paul Huang and Sherry Griffin—were also given approval to enter the Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP).

### MVP AWARDED

CJC basketball star Chris Porter was recognized at the CJC Board meeting on June 16. WTYS Radio Station Manager Bill Dunkle presented Porter with his station's annual MVP award. CJC Board chair Suzanne Glass-Troutman presented Porter a certificate of his NJCAA All-American selection. Porter is Chipola's first-ever First Team All American pick. He was also named Florida JUCO Player of the Year and was two-time Panhandle Player of the Year. The Abbeville, AL, native, who has signed to play at Auburn University, averaged 22.9 points and 11.2 rebounds during his two-year CJC career. He scored a total of 1,332 points in 58 games.

### TIC TELECOM AGREES

TIC Telecom recently signed an agreement with Chipola to form a training partnership. TIC offers training leading to the certification of Installer Technician II, a high-wage job in the telecommunications industry. Through a state grant, Chipola will provide funds to help TIC expand its training services.

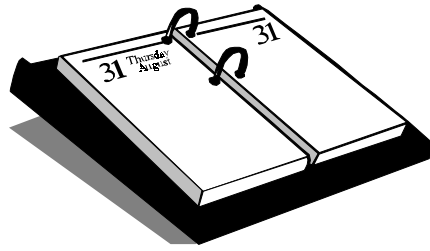
