Education Commissioner to visit CJC June 7

Florida Commissioner of Education, Tom Gallagher, will be on the campus of Chipola Junior College Monday, June 7.

The purpose of the meeting is to discuss implications of the School Disaggregated Data Reports with superintendents, district staff, and principals from the CJC district.

David Mosrie, from the commissioner's offices says, "Recent statewide data reveals an achievement gap in many of our schools. As schools strive to serve increasingly di-

verse student populations, they must find new ways to help all students achieve at higher levels. This meeting will acquaint staff with the latest available data, provide strategies to communicate this information to diverse audiences, and provide examples of best practices where schools are closing the achievement gap."

The meeting begins at 9 a.m. at the CJC Auditorium.

Area Educators to meet at Region IV Workshop

Over 250 area teachers will attend a Region IV School to Work/Tech Prep Workshop June 10-11 at Blue Springs Baptist Assembly. Registration will begin at 7:30 a.m., with opening sessions at 8:30.

The workshop, planned by elementary, middle, and high school teachers with representatives from Chipola and Washington-Holmes Technical Center, is based on requests by K-12 classroom teachers in the district. "We have tried to plan sessions to address issues faced by teachers and public school administrators," says workshop organizer Judy Riviere, STW/TP Manager.

Thursday's keynote speaker will be Janie Varner, a humorous and motivational speaker. Graceville Elementary School students will also make a special presentation. Friday's keynote speaker will be Dr. Janet Scaglione. The region's Gold and Silver Zone winners will also be introduced.

A total of 16 breakout sessions will be presented by experts from across Florida and the Southeast. Most sessions will target elementary,

middle, or high school teachers, but several are applicable to anyone who works in education. Chipola's own Dr. Lou Cleveland will present "Where the Twain Should Meet: Adapting Teaching Methods to Learning Styles," a special session on applied teaching.

One session of special interest to Chipola's staff is "Articulation and Career Guidance: Creating a Seamless Transition for Students," presented by Gail Hartzog. This seminar uses institutional research about students who graduate from area high schools and Chipola's efforts to recruit and retain them.

"Grant Writing 101" to be presented by Dr. Barbara Jones, a professional grant writer from Northwest Mississippi Community College, may also be of interest to CJC staff. This session will begin each afternoon at 12:30 in CJC's TV Production Studio and Technology Center.

There is no registration fee, but reservations are requested for lunch and seating availability.

Apply now for Occupational Therapy Assistant program

Persons interested in Chipola's first Occupational Therapy Assistant Class should apply immediately.

Essay and application deadline is June 15. Twelve occupational therapy assistant candidates will be selected by June 30 for the Fall Semester of 1999.

The program was recently granted Developing Status by the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) of the

American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA). Once accreditation has been obtained, program graduates will qualify for the National examination that leads to certification as Certified Occupational Therapy Assistants (COTA).
