Dr. Sarah Clemmons, dean of instruction, said, "We are looking forward to hosting another festival. It is always a pleasure to have area high school students on our campus for a day of rigorous academic competition."

Porter bringing national attention to Chipola

Auburn's Chris Porter continues to excite his devoted CJC fans though it's been a year since his last slam dunk at Chipola.

This week Porter appears on the Southeast region cover of *Sports Illustrated* and on March 11, he made the front page of *USA Today*.

Porter was recently selected second team All-American by the Associated Press wire service and the NCAA. He was also named First Team All SEC and SEC player of the year.

Chipola coach Carl Nash, who recruited Porter out of Abbeville High School, says, "We're awfully proud of Chris. It doesn't surprise us. He

deserves all the individual honors, but I know he's more concerned about the success of the team."

Porter was Chipola's first-ever First Team All American pick. He was also named Florida JUCO Player of the Year and was two-time Panhandle Player of the Year. He averaged 22.9 points and 11.2 rebounds during his two-year CJC career. He scored a total of 1,332 points in 58 games.

Porter has committed to remain at Auburn for his senior season. Auburn whipped Winthrop 80-41 on March 11 in the South Region division of NCCAA National Tournament. Auburn plays

Chipola baseball opens conference season

The Chipola Indians baseball team begins the hunt for a third straight trip to the State Junior College tournament when they open conference play March 16 at Pensacola.

The team returns home to host the Pirates on Wednesday at 6 p.m. Chipola travels to Gulf Coast on March 20, and returns home to host the Commodores on Sunday, March 21 at 1 p.m.

The Indians continue their "one home, one away" schedule throughout the conference season which runs through April 21.

The Indians are 28-3 as of March 10, with two losses to Lake City and one to Delgado (New Orleans).

Johnson says most every team in the Panhandle Conference is very good. "TCC is 26-4 with a 17 game win streak. OW was 22-4 at one time with an outstanding pitching staff. Pensacola has the best team they've ever had. Gulf coast is 21-7, and North Florida can beat anybody. Each game is going to be very important. The teams that bounce back are the teams who are going to go all the way. It's going to be a war," says Johnson.

Pitching is the key to the Indians' trip to a third straight state tournament. "Our starters are going to have to give us 6 or 7 innings to get us

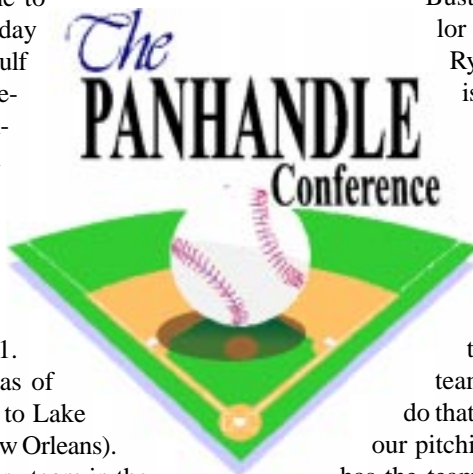
to our relief staff. And we've got a few good relievers," says Johnson. The pitching staff has had great success in the early season. Justin Lord of Marianna is the teams' leading pitcher at 5-0.

Buster Drasdo is 4-0. Blake Taylor is 5-2. Andrew Rush is 3-0. Ryan Smith is 3-1. Max Havel is 3-0 and Caleb Crosby is 2-0 with seven saves.

Johnson says he's not yet satisfied with the team's defensive play, but couldn't be happier with the offensive production. "We'll swing the bat, that's the strength of our team. We've got to continue to do that to take some pressure off of our pitching." Eric Rankin of Bristol

has the team's highest average at .531, with 15 runs scored and 14 RBI's. Charlie Dees is .408 with 9 doubles, a triple, 14 homeruns, 49 RBI's and three stolen bases. Drew Miller is .397 with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers and 18 RBI's. Cameron Likely is .387 with 2 doubles, 3 triples, 2 homers, 21 RBI's and 23 stolen bases. Brennan Dees is .381, with 8 doubles, 2 triples, 7 homers, 25 RBI's, and 8 stolen bases.

Last season Chipola finished third in state, just one game away from the championship. The Indians have appeared in the state tournament both of Johnson's first two years at CJC.

Tips for Campus Safety

The following information excerpted from the CJC Safety Manual is published here upon recommendation from the CJC Governance Council. The purpose of this article is to inform students and employees about safety issues.

CAMPUS SAFETY

Students and employees are encouraged to take the following precautions to help make the campus safer:

1. When walking, particularly at blind corners, keep to the right. Use a handrail when going up or down stairs.
2. Report immediately spills of water, oil, or other liquids or excessive dust, dirt or any other debris on floors.
3. When on campus at night, stay in well-lighted areas. Try to avoid traveling across campus alone. Always let someone know

that you are on campus and approximately when you will leave the campus.

4. Remove immediately loose objects such as pencils, paper clips, matches and papers from the floor or stairs.
5. Exercise caution when entering or exiting a room or building. This is especially important after spending several hours inside when you might not be aware of weather changes which cause slippery surfaces. Be especially careful when arriving for and departing night classes.
6. Since the Chipola campus is set in "natural" surroundings, stay on sidewalks as much as possible as you travel across campus and watch for protruding roots and fallen limbs.
7. Report any poorly lighted areas.

Lifeguard courses set at Chipola

Two Lifeguard training courses are scheduled at Chipola beginning April 2.

A weekend class will meet Saturdays, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., and Sundays, from 12 Noon to 4:30 p.m. The class will not meet Easter Sunday, but will meet on Friday, April 2, from 3 to 6 p.m. Cost is \$115 including books.

A weeknight class will meet Monday through Thursday, April 12 through April 26, from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. Cost is \$130 including books.

Students must be at least 15 years of age

and should be strong swimmers in good physical condition. Those who complete either course will earn American Red Cross Lifeguard Training certification which is good for three years, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer which is good for one year. There are several employment opportunities for lifeguards at the CJC Pool and throughout the Panhandle.

"Trial By Jury" to play at Jackson Courthouse

"Trial by Jury" will play five more times this week.
