## “Trial by Jury” to play at Jackson Courthouse

The Chipola Junior College production of “Trial by Jury,” will play five times in the Jackson County Court House, beginning March 13.

Performances are Saturday, March 13, 7:30 p.m.; Sunday, March 14, 3:00 p.m.; Monday, March 15, at Noon and at 7:30 p.m.; and Tuesday, March 16, at Noon.

Two performances are scheduled in the Chipola Arts Center: Wednesday, March 17, at 11:15 a.m., and Thursday, March 18 at 2 p.m.

According to Joan Stadsklev, CJC Director of Fine and Performing Arts, the performances on March 13, 14, and 15 are open to the public. The performances on March 16, 17, and 18 are for specific groups and organizations but CJC students, staff, and faculty may also attend these.

CJC actors Brianna Gelzer (the jilted bride), Brian Walker (the learned judge) and Adam Basford (the defendant) star in the show, and

will be supported by a large musical cast. CJC music instructor Dr. Ed Lyon is directing the show.

Gilbert and Sullivan wrote 11 comic operettas including Mikado, Pirates of Penzance and HMS Pinafore. Trial by Jury, a 45-minute operetta, was the first of their projects. The show has delighted audiences for over 100 years, and is well-known as the predecessor of the modern-day “Broadway musical.” Set in a British courtroom, a jilted bride sues her fiancé to marry her. The quintessential British humor as depicted by the composers is delightful.

CJC students and employees receive one complimentary ticket to the performance of their choice. General admission tickets are \$8 for adults, and \$4 for ages 18 and under. Tickets are available at the CJC Book Store.

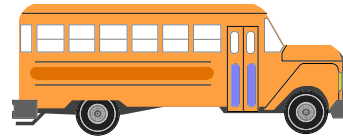
## Jackson County Transportation adds Chipola stop

The Indians continue their homestand with Middle Georgia on Thursday, March 11, at 6 p.m.; Jones (Mississippi) on Friday, March 12, at 1 p.m., and Muscatine for a doubleheader on Sunday, March 14, at 1 p.m.

The Indians improved to 23-2 after sweeping a pair of wins at Wallace College in Dothan on March 2. The Indians took the first game, 8-3, behind winning pitcher Blake Taylor (4-2). Taylor pitched 10 strikeouts and allowed

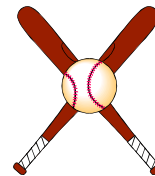
only three runs in seven innings. Leading hitters for the game were Eric Rankin, 3 for 3, and Michael Brown, 3 for 3 with a solo homerun.

Max Havel (3-0) earned the Indians' 7-5 win in game two with Wallace. Caleb Crosby earned his seventh save of the year. Cameron Likely was 2 for 4 at the plate. Dees was 2 for 4, with his second two-run homer of the day.

The Indians were scheduled to play at Jeff Davis (Alabama) on March 4, and at Delgado (New Orleans) on March 5 and 6.

Conference play begins March 16, when the Indians travel to Pensacola.
