Lord Wins Kirkland Award



Charlene Lord, CJC Mathematics Instructor, was chosen by her peers to receive the Kirkland Award for Excellence in Teaching at the recent CJC graduation.

Lord has worked at CJC for 9 years where she teaches Precalculus, Liberal Arts Mathematics and Business Calculus.

Lord is a graduate of Huntingdon College, and earned a master's degree from Troy State University at Dothan. A native of Altha, Lord taught at Altha School for 19 years.

She is chair-elect of the CJC Governance Council, and is current vice-chair. She also serves on the college's Admission/Appeals/Grievance Committee. She is a member of the Council of Chipola Educators (CCE), and the Florida Association of Community Colleges (FACC).

She is faculty sponsor of two student groups: Phi Theta Kappa honor society and Mu Alpha Theta mathematics fraternity.

Lord is the daughter of Grady Tew and the late Velma Tew of Altha. She and her husband, James H. Lord, have two grown daughters, Kimberly and Belinda. The family is active in the First United Methodist Church of Marianna.

The Kirkland Award was endowed ten years ago by brothers J. R. and David Kirkland in honor of their parents Willis and Carolyn Kirkland of Marianna. The endowment provides \$1,000 to a CJC teacher chosen by fellow faculty members.
