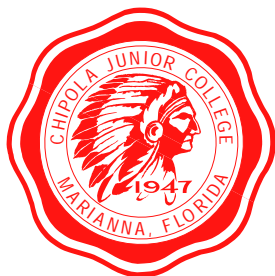

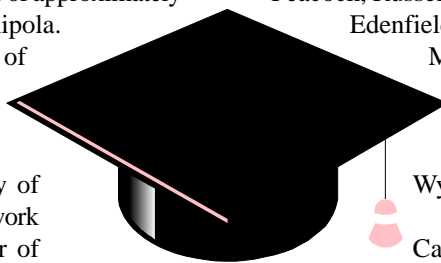

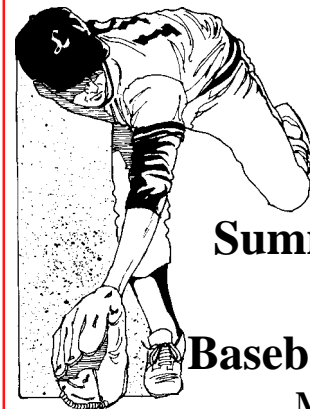

Johnson will also be offering a baseball camp for ages 8-12, May 31- June 3. The camps will meet from 9 a.m. to noon. Cost is \$60.

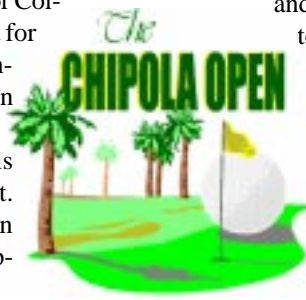
