Application deadline for the day Law Enforcement Academy is June 1. The application deadline for the evening Corrections Academy is June 8.

A **40-hour First Responder to Medical Emergencies** class will be held June 21-25 from 8 am - 5 pm at the Public Service Building. This course is recommended for those seeking a FDLE instructor certification in Medical First Responder. This class is trust funded for Florida Law Enforcement Officers.

A **56-hour Firearms Instructor** class will be held June 1-10, from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. at the CJC

Firing Range. The cost for this class is \$332.

A **20-hour Human Diversity Instructor Trainer** class will be held June 14-16 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. at the Public Service Building. This class is recommended for all certified instructors. The cost for this class is \$45.

A **16-hour Self contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) Instructor Trainer** course will be held June 17-18 from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. at the Public Service Building. Kids' College begins Tuesday, June 1

The first session of Kids' College and Teen College at Chipola Junior College begins Tuesday, June 1 at 9 a.m.

There are still plenty of openings for the program which runs June 1-June 10. Parents may register their kids in the Continuing Education Office beginning at 8 a.m. on June 1. Students who are pre-registered should report to the CJC Arts Center.

Both sessions have morning camps from 9 a.m. to Noon and afternoon camps from 1-4 p.m. Cost is \$50 and up per session for either morning or afternoon.

Kids may choose from one of six morning

camps, or two of dozens of afternoon classes. Early and late classes are available for parents who wish to drop their kids off as early as 7 a.m. or pick them up as late as 5:30 p.m. Ages 7-12 are welcome. The cost is \$50 and up.
