Governor to hold office hours at Chipola

Governor Jeb Bush will hold open office hours at Chipola Junior College in Marianna on Tuesday, Nov. 14, from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The office hours will allow residents in Jackson County and surrounding communities an opportunity to inform the Governor of concerns and issues important to them.

“Bringing government closer to the people is a commitment I have made to all 15 million of Florida’s residents. Our open office hours offer Floridians on the local level a unique opportunity to act as partners in solving problems and meeting the challenges that face our great state,” Governor Bush said.

The Governor will periodically hold open office hours around the state to ensure citizens have additional access to leaders in state government and to give them an opportunity to voice their concerns to the Governor’s Office. The Governor’s open office hours have previously been held in Pensacola, Cape Coral, Palatka and Madison.

Registration for residents interested in a one-on-one, five-minute meeting with Governor Bush begins at 7:30 a.m. at the Chipola Public Service Building.

Staff members of the Governor’s Citizens Services Office will also be available to offer additional assistance.

Roach wins Faculty/Admin Award

Counselor Lindsay Roach is the recipient of the Faculty/Administrator Employee of the Month award at Chipola Junior College.

Roach has work at CJC since 1991. In addition to advising students, he also teaches the freshmen orientation course and is co-sponsor of the Chipola Brain Bowl Team. He represents the faculty on the CJC Governance Council and currently serves on three college committees: Honors, Disciplinary/Residence and Intercollegiate Athletics.

He is a member of the Council of Chipola Educators and is especially active in the Florida Association of Community Colleges, serving as

chair of Chipola's FACC Scholarship Committee. He also is a long serving executive board member of the State FACC Student Development Commission of which he recently was named Chair Elect.

Roach's wife Nell, a graduate of CJC, is an elementary guidance counselor at Grand Ridge School. Three of the couple's four children attended Chipola.

The award includes a plaque, reserved parking for a month, a \$300 bonus, and a \$50 gift certificate from the College Book Store. Monthly winners are eligible for the annual award.

Chvatal/Kritzer duo to perform at CJC

The Chvatal/Kritzer Duo will perform at the CJC Theater, Tuesday, **Nov. 14**, at 7 p.m.

This second event in the Chipola Artist series will feature Soprano, Janet Chvatal, one of Europe's rising opera celebrities, (and star of the Phantom of the Opera) in Vienna, and top classical guitarist, Scott Kritzer. Their program will feature North and South American Folk Songs, exotic works from Spain, and beloved opera melodies including the famous "Habanera" from Carmen and Gershwin's "Summertime."

Chvatal, a young coloratura, recently made her first Compact Disc recording under the SONY Label and appeared in a live telecast of "Famous Scenes from Opera" for Germany's largest television network ARD; a series which airs to millions of Europeans over the next several seasons.

Guitarist Scott Kritzer [pronounced *Crytser*], has performed numerous critically acclaimed recitals on two continents including concerts in New York's Carnegie Recital Hall and Wigmore Hall in London, as well as performances in Los Angeles,

San Francisco, Cincinnati, Las Vegas and Sapporo, Japan. Kritzer recently performed for the California Center for the Performing Arts in Escondido. Other performers on the series included Itzhak Perlman, Ivo Pogorelich, Cecilia Bartoli and the Emerson String Quartet. Kritzer's performance was sold-out eight months in advance.

Two other performances are scheduled in the 2000-01 Chipola Artist Series. **Chicago City Limits**, comedy and improvisation, hits the stage **Jan. 8**. New York's longest running comedy revue Chicago City Limits raises improvisational theatre to an art form. **The Florida Vocal Arts Ensemble** performs **Jan. 30**. Five FSU music faculty members perform folk song arrangements of Beethoven to New American works.

Section 125 Flexible Spending Account Open Enrollment

Open enrollment for the Section 125 Flexible Spending Accounts (Medical and Child Care Reimbursement) will be Monday and Tuesday, Nov. 20 and 21.

Tom Watson with Custom Benefit Services, will be on campus Nov. 20 and 21. Employees who wish to participate in the 2001 Plan Year must complete an enrollment form available in the Human Resources Office. If you wish, you may stop by and complete your form prior to the open enrollment period.

The Medical Reimbursement and Child Care Reimbursement programs allow employees to set aside money on a tax-free basis to pay for medical expenses and child care cost. Some of the medical expenses that are eligible to be reimbursed include;

deductibles, co-payments, prescription costs, dental and vision expenses, along with orthodontist expenses. There are a number of other eligible expenses as well.

The benefit of the plan is that employees are able to pay for their medical and child care cost with tax-free dollars. By electing this benefit, employees will be able to save approximately 25% on their expenses.

Nov. 20 and 21 also is the open enrollment period for the following benefits: CANCER, UNIVERSAL LIFE and SHORT TERM DISABILITY.

Chipola to host Panhandle Classic Nov. 17 and 18

The Chipola Indians host the gigantic Panhandle Basketball Classic, Nov. 17 and 18.

The ten-team, ten-game extravaganza tips off at Noon both days and climaxes with Chipola hosting Palm Beach on Friday at 8 p.m., and Santa Fe on Saturday at 8 p.m.

Friday's games include: Gulf Coast vs. Westchester at Noon; Tallahassee vs. Cincinnati State at 2 p.m.; Pensacola vs. Daytona at 4 p.m.; Okaloosa-Walton vs. Santa Fe at 6 p.m.; and Chipola vs. Palm Beach at 8 p.m.

Saturday's games are: Gulf Coast vs. Cincinnati State at Noon; Tallahassee vs. Westchester at 2 p.m.; Pensacola vs. Palm Beach at 4 p.m.; Okaloosa-Walton vs. Daytona Beach at 6 p.m.; Chipola vs. Santa Fe at 8 p.m.

The Indians jumped out to a 2-0 mark after a pair of wins in the *Tallahassee Democrat* Classic Nov. 3 and 4 in the Capitol City. Chipola narrowly defeated New York's Globe Institute of Technology 100-95 on Nov. 4. Chipola's Lance Buoncristiani hit a jumper with 1:57 remaining to give the Indians the 94-92 lead and eventually the win. Lavelle Felton led CJC with 24 points and 7 rebounds. Chipola players go Division 1

Chipola sophomores **Janerio Spurlock** and **Lavelle Felton** both signed with Division 1 colleges during a press conference at Chipola on Nov. 8.

Spurlock signed with **Kansas State** University. At 6'6, 200 pounds, he was Chipola's leading scorer last season with a 20-point per game average. He was the second leading scorer in the Panhandle Conference in 2000 and earned All-Conference honors. As one of the league's top returning players Spurlock is rated as a pre-season All-American by *Street and Smith Magazine*.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Spurlock averaged 22 points, 9 rebounds and 3 assists at Aiken High. He set a school scoring record with 1,834 points, and was named Cincinnati Player of the Year in 1999.

Chipola scored a season opening 100-82 win over Palm Beach on Nov. 3. The Indians poured in 14 three-pointers. Spurlock led all scorers with 30 points, including five threes. Felton hit 22. Wilder scored 16.

The Lady Indians are 2-1 after a 77-71 over Darton on Nov. 7. Chipola was led by Satoya Spates with 16 and Tasha Mathis with 13 points and 13 rebounds. Kamika Collins had 13 points. D'Leisha Cockerham had 10 points.

Chipola whipped St. Petersburg Community College 82-62 on Nov. 4. Mathis led with 30 points. Collins scored 14. Temecca Barnes added 13. The Lady Indians lost a tough game with Hillsborough on Nov. 3, 86-79. Collins was CJC's top scorer with 21. Barnes scored 19. Cockerham and Spates scored 16 apiece. The Lady Indians have a week off before hosting Santa Fe Tuesday, Nov. 21, at 5 p.m.

head coach Ryan Cross says, "Janerio had a lot of options. He visited Kansas in early September and really liked what he saw. They've got a new coaching staff and they're in one of the top leagues in the country. He should be able to go in and play a lot of minutes as a junior."

Lavelle Felton of Milwaukee, WI, signed with **Louisiana Tech**. Felton is a 6'4 transfer from West Plains Junior College in Missouri where he averaged 17 points and six rebounds as a freshman. He was an all state player at James Madison High (WI) averaging 24 points and seven assists, and leading his team to back to back regional championships.

Felton and Spurlock have each averaged 23 points per game in the Indians' first two outings this season.

Chipola Show Choir will dance to Copland's "Hoe Down" from *Rodeo*, choreographed by Rebecca Parmer, and the college's Jazz Band under the direction of Dr. Allen Molineux will salute Louis Armstrong with "Blueberry Hill" and "Mack the Knife" as well as featuring other jazz greats.

Anyone interested needs to see a counselor in Student Services for a graduation check. The graduation ceremony will take place May 3,

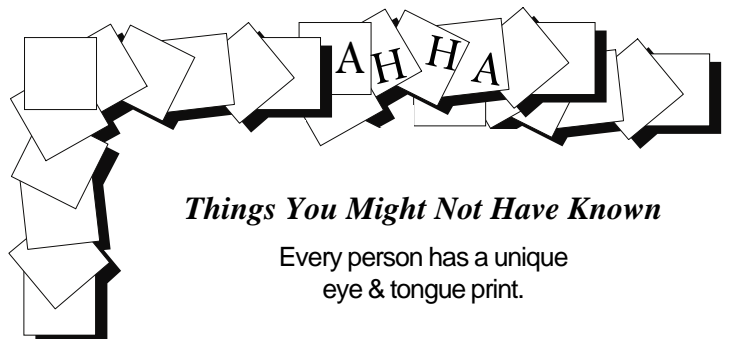
2001. Fall graduates are eligible and encouraged to participate in the ceremony.
