Chipola Basketball squads win season openers

Chipola's men's and women's basketball teams opened their seasons with wins.

The Indians scored a big 70-64 win over Santa Fe Community College on Nov. 6. **Clyde Ellis** led CJC with 23 points. **Dennis Cannon** scored 12, and **Curtis Harris** added 11. Also scoring for CJC were: **Anthony Brown** with 8, **Randy Hughes** with 7 and **Robert Williams** with 4.

Chipola followed up with a 76-52 win over Andrew College on Nov. 7. **Ellis** led with 17. **Cannon** added 12 and **Cecil Jackson** scored 10. Also on the books for Chipola were: **Hughes** with 9, **Sam Cox** with 9, **James Broyles** with 6 and **Michael Hardaway** with 3.

The Indians suffered their first misfire of the season at the hands of FCCJ with a 91-85 overtime loss in Jacksonville on Nov. 9. CJC led up to the last two minutes of the game, but CJC turn-

overs and missed rebounds gave FCCJ the edge.

The Lady Indians opened their season with a 62-48 win over L.B. Wallace in Andalusia on Monday, Nov. 9. Freshman **Keelee Traylor** led Chipola with 12 points and 10 rebounds.

Chipola hosted the Best Western Classic Nov. 13 and 14. The CJC Lady Indians played Darton College and Daytona Beach. Chipola's men played Holmes Community College (MS) and FCCJ. Chipola will host the Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 27-28.

Chipola recently added a new lighting and sound system, with lasers and smoke, that should add a good deal of excitement to the games in the Johnson Health Center. Athletic director Carl Nash says, "Fans will get the feel of a big time program when our teams come out for introductions this season."

The reunion is free and open to all Chipola alumni. **Light hors d'oeuvres will be served, and a cash bar will be available. No reservations are necessary.**

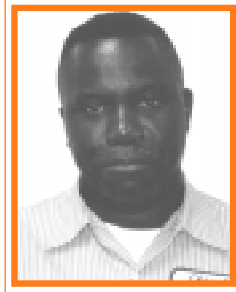
The University Club is located in the new FSU University Center (Football Stadium South end zone).

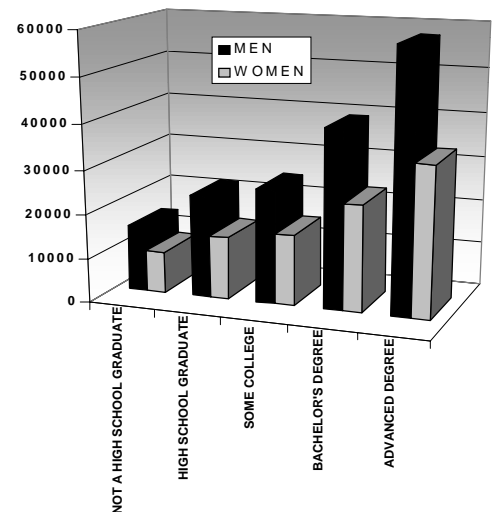
**Education/Earnings: What's the Connection?

Studies repeatedly show that persons with the most education report the highest average annual earnings. Shown are averages for men and women by highest level of education completed.

Not everyone who holds advanced degrees report high incomes, and many who left school early (Bill Gates) have high earnings today. However, there is a clear relationship between the amount of education and subsequent earnings. Associate Degree recipients will earn over a quarter million dollars more than a high school graduate over their life time. Wellness Program offers new opportunities

Corporate rates have been established with the Marianna Fitness Center and Jackson Wellness Center in Marianna, and the Chipley Therapy and Wellness Center. These rates are \$16 per month for unlimited use of the facility.

SPD funds have been allocated to the Wellness Program to help with funding of the monthly fees. SPD will pay \$8 per month (half of the monthly fee) of your membership. These funds are available for employees currently using either facility or for anyone interested in joining either facility.

To sign up, stop by Lou Kind's office or the Human Resources Office and sign an authoriza-

tion for payroll deduction form allowing the payroll department to deduct \$8 a month from your payroll check. The college will then add the additional fee and forward it along with your name to the fitness center you have selected. The fitness center will issue you a membership card.

The planned effective date will be January 1, 1999 with fees deducted from the last December, 1998 payroll check for career employees and administrators and the January 9, 1999 payroll check for faculty.
