Drama and went on to Broadway. Gorshin was the first to "break through" as a headliner in Las Vegas main showrooms with an act that emphasized impressions. His major breakthrough came in the early 1960's when he was signed for the part of "The Riddler" on the Batman TV series, a role for which he received an Emmy nomination.

Lately, he's guest starred on "Lois and Clark" and the Nickelodeon series, "Are You Afraid of the Dark?" His recent movie credits include "Meteor Man," "Twelve Monkeys," with Bruce Willis and Brad Pitt, and the soon-to-be-released "Twilight of the Ice Nymphs" with Shelly Duvall.

The Hollywood Reporter says, "Frank Gorshin is so talented, he has to be one of the greatest entertainers today. He is an actor—a fine actor. He is a singer—a fine singer. He is a comic—a splendid comic."

Hear Hart's Rules for Success

Chipola grad James Hart will speak on "Hart's Rules for Success or "How to Climb the Corporate Ladder in a Hurricane" at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, Nov. 4, Building L 401.

The meeting is sponsored by the CJC's Students In Free Enterprise and Phi Beta Lambda.

Hart, a 1958 graduate of Chipola recently retired as vice president of public affairs for Duke Energy Corporation and returned to his old family home in the Paramore community.

He began his career working part-time as a radio announcer at WTYS while attending Chipola and was the first president of what was then called the Radio Club. Jim also did the play-by-play broadcast of Chipola's basketball games.

Following graduation he went into the Air Force and came back to Marianna for pilot training at Graham Air Base. After the Air Force, Jim became news director and nightly anchor at WTVY in Dothan. From there he went to WSFA-TV in Montgomery and then into public relations for Gulf Oil Corporation. After Chevron bought Gulf in 1985 he became vice president of a natu-

ral gas company in Houston. That company merged with Duke Power Company of Charlotte, NC, to form the tenth largest energy company in the world.

During his 40-year career, Jim helped manage three major corporate mergers, completed 35 years of active and reserve duty with the Air Force, retiring as a one star general. He earned LLB and JD degrees from the University of Alabama Jones Law School.

He has received national and international awards and recognition for his corporate work and is listed in "Who's Who in America." He has won three Public Relations Society of America Silver Anvil awards (the Oscar of PR) and served as president of the Texas Public Relations Association and the national Public Affairs Council.

Jim and his wife Patty (also of Marianna) have two children and five grandchildren. He is a certified flight instructor with more than 5,000 flying hours in over 20 different types of aircraft.
