Chipola shines at State FACC Convention

Chipola Junior College was one of the most talked-about colleges at the Florida Association of Community Colleges Annual Convention, Nov. 1-3, at the Sheraton World Resort in Orlando.

The highlight of the convention was the farewell address of Joyce Traynom, state FACC president for the year 2000. Traynom is executive assistant to CJC president, Dr. Dale O'Daniel.

The Chipola chapter of FACC garnered numerous awards this year including two membership awards. FACC chapter president, Evelyn Ward, accepted awards for Chipola's membership efforts: 50% or Better Membership and Greatest Percentage of Employees as Members (180 members). Ward also was awarded a "Lifesaver Award" by Lynn Burden, Region I director. CJC faculty member, Lou Kind, was honored as an Unsung Hero for her contributions to the chapter as Fundraising Chair.

Several other CJC employees were elected to state and regional offices. Sandra Harrell, CJC athletics administrative assistant, was elected Region I director. CJC counselor Lindsay Roach was selected as chairman-elect of the Student Development Commission. CJC librarian Dr. Carolyn Poole also will serve as chairman for Learning Resources Commission.

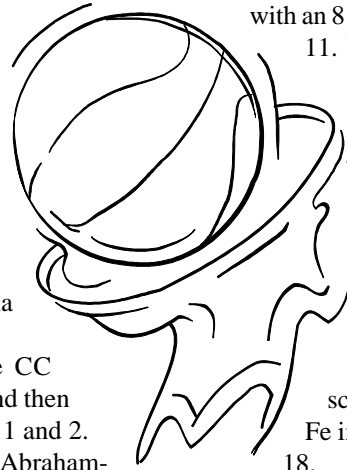
Lady Indians play Tuesday

The Chipola Lady Indians host Santa Fe CC Tuesday, Nov. 21, at 5 p.m. in the Johnson Health Center.

Chipola's women are 3-2 on the season after a splitting a pair in The Lady Indian Classic, Nov. 10 and 11. CJC whipped Gadsden State 80-53 on Nov. 10. Satoya Spates led CJC with 16. Cockerham had 13. Sowo Varney had 10. The Lady Indians lost to Daytona 89-77 on Nov. 11. Cockerham led CJC with 15. Tasha Mathis had 14. Spates added 12.

The Indians host Manatee CC Thursday, Nov. 30 at 7:30 p.m., and then the Ramada Limited Classic Dec. 1 and 2. CJC plays FCCJ on Dec. 1 and Abraham-Baldwin on Dec. 2.

The Indians are off to a strong 3-1 record after splitting a pair of games in the Milton H.



Johnson Classic on Nov. 10-11. The Indians crushed St. John's River CC 114-85 on Nov. 10. Chipola suffered its first misfire of the season with an 81-79 loss to Tyler (Texas) CC on Nov.

11. Wilder led CJC with 30. Felton had 17. Kareem Johnson pulled in 11 rebounds and scored eight points. Chipola defeated New York's Globe Institute of Technology 100-95 on Nov. 4. The Indians scored a season opening 100-82 win over Palm Beach on Nov. 3. The Indians poured in 14 three-pointers. Spurlock led all scorers with 30 points, including five threes. CJC was scheduled to play Palm Beach and Santa Fe in the Panhandle Classic, Nov. 17 and 18.

Medical Insurance Billing and Coding (OST 1455) will be offered Thursday evenings from 5:30 to 8:30.

The course is designed to introduce the student to patient billing and CPT & IDC-9- CM, the major

coding system for procedures and services performed by physicians and used in hospitals and other health care settings.

Section 125 Flexible Spending Account Open Enrollment

Open enrollment for the Section 125 Flexible Spending Accounts (Medical and Child Care Reimbursement) will be Monday and Tuesday, Nov. 20 and 21.

Tom Watson with Custom Benefit Services, will be on campus Nov. 20 and 21. Employees who wish to participate in the 2001 Plan Year must complete an enrollment form available in the Human Resources Office. If you wish, you may stop by and complete your form prior to the open enrollment period.

The Medical Reimbursement and Child Care Reimbursement programs allow employees to set aside money on a tax-free basis to pay for medical expenses and child care cost. Some of the medical expenses that are eligible to be reimbursed include; deductibles, co-payments, prescription costs, den-

tal and vision expenses, along with orthodontist expenses. There are a number of other eligible expenses as well.

The benefit of the plan is that employees are able to pay for their medical and child care cost with tax-free dollars. By electing this benefit, employees will be able to save approximately 25% on their expenses.

Nov. 20 and 21 also is the open enrollment period for the following benefits: CANCER, UNIVERSAL LIFE and SHORT TERM DISABILITY.

Chipola Junior College sophomore **Jose Bautista** signed with Division 1 University of South Carolina during a press conference at Chipola on Nov. 8.

The right-fielder/third baseman hit .325 during his freshman year at CJC. He also hit 19 doubles, three triples, eight homeruns and drove

in 52 RBI's. Additionally, he stole 22 bases on the season.

A **CPR** course will meet Dec. 5 and 6 from 5 to 9 p.m. Cost is \$34.

A **10-Hour Childcare Behavior Observation** course will meet Dec. 16 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Courses meet on Fridays from 6-9 p.m. and on Saturdays from 8-3 p.m. Cost for each 10-hour course is \$31. A **20-Hour Childcare Training** course will be meet Dec. 1, 2, 8, 9 on Fridays from 6-9 p.m. and on Saturdays from 8-3 p.m. Cost is \$62. A **Fiber Optics course** will be offered Monday through Thursday, Dec. 4 through 8. Cost is \$1,100, which includes books and materials.

A **40-Hour Insurance Pre-Licensing Home Study** course is being offered for \$295.

Anyone interested needs to see a counselor in Student Services for a graduation check. The graduation ceremony will take place May 3,

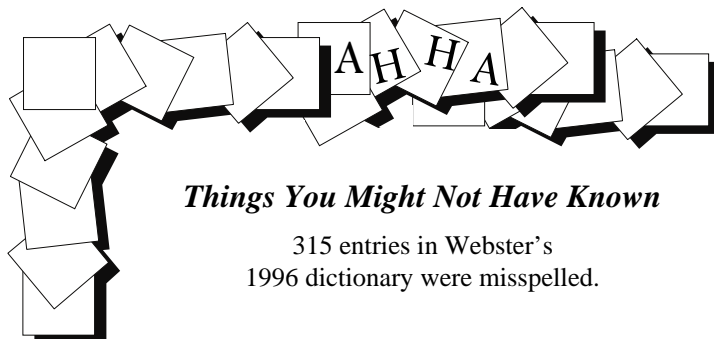
2001. Fall graduates are eligible and encouraged to participate in the ceremony.
