Chipola grad tapped for Leroy Collins Award

CJC's Alumnus of the Year **David Hart** has been selected to receive the Leroy Collins Outstanding Alumni Award from the Florida Association of Community Colleges.

The award will be presented at the FACC Annual Convention on Nov. 17 at the Bay Point Convention Center in Panama City.

A 1974 graduate of Chipola, Hart is best known worldwide for his portrayal of the lovable policeman Parker Williams in the long-running network television series, "**In the Heat of the Night.**"

Hart was born in the hometown of his alma mater, Marianna. His acting career began in high school with the title role in the musical "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown." Hart says, "I sort of got cajoled into auditioning by a good friend of

mine, Jerry Longe, not knowing that I was making a decision that would effect the rest of my life." Hart's father, the late Lloyd Hart, came to see the production and was surprised by his son's performance. Dad knew of David's dilemma concerning college, so he convinced Chipola's Director of Theatre, Larry Alford, to offer his son a scholarship.

Hart says, "Although I was about to graduate I hadn't exactly decided where I was going to college or what I might major in. I had been offered engineering scholarships, but when the offer was made for me to go to school and do plays...I jumped at the opportunity and was soon a student at Chipola."

David worked on four major productions a year at Chipola, where learned the craft of per-

forming, as well as, designing and set building. Chipola's theatrical program was highly-regarded because of the active community involvement. It was through this experience that David further developed his sense of working for the good of the community.

Hart says, "This time at CJC set forth a sense of dedication and a level of professionalism that I have held onto throughout my career. There was only a handful of dedicated students who learned to give 110 percent into preparing the oft times large productions. There were many times, when, to meet a deadline, our enthusiasm would carry us through the night to finish a project. Former CJC theater director Dena Moree was among us "crazy kids" who would give our all to make sure that our plays were spectacular."

After Chipola, David attended the University of West Florida and was chosen as the Outstanding Graduate of the Theatre Department in 1976. While continuing to build upon the training he had begun at Chipola, he would often return to CJC to perform as a guest artist.

Upon graduating from UWF, Hart was invited to perform in an Actors' Equity production of "Oklahoma!" at the Showboat Dinner Theater in St. Petersburg thus beginning the Profes-

sional phase of his career. A move to New York City followed in 1977, and since then David has enjoyed a successful career with many film and television credits. His film appearances include: "The River," "Silver Bullet," "Legal Eagles," "The Real McCoy," and "Three Wishes." Television movie credits include, "A Father For Charlie," "In the Line of Duty: Manhunt in the Dakotas," HBO's "The Land of the Free" and the inaugural production of "Oprah Winfrey Presents: Before Women Had Wings."

In addition to acting talent, Hart also has a big heart. He says, "I have always felt blessed by the good fortune I have experienced in my career and have tried to give back to my community. Through gifts or activism, I support a wide variety of organizations ranging from the American Cancer Society to Make-a-Wish, Habitat for Humanity, Inner City Games, and the Aids Project. Having been blessed with three bright, healthy children, ranging in ages from 14 to 20 years, I have sponsored for nearly that same 20 years, a variety of youngsters through the World Vision Organization." Hart also helped Chipola mark its Law Enforcement Appreciation Day Celebration several years ago with a special guest appearance at his alma mater.

Along with his dedication to the community, David has been active in church. Growing up he attended St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Marianna and today attends All Saints Parish in Beverly Hills. "It sounds kind of funny to say I go to church in Beverly Hills, but All Saints has the same warm, nurturing feeling I grew up with in Marianna at Saint Luke's. The principal Ministers here are women and the caring they display exemplifies the best a church can offer-it has good people helping those in need."

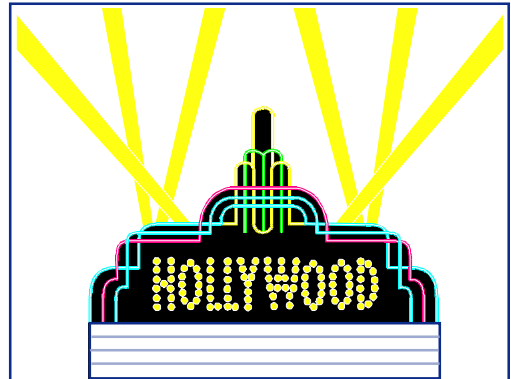
