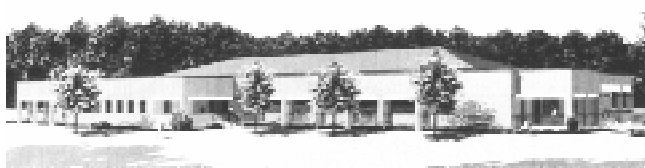

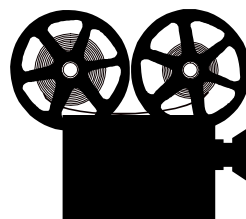

Banks will be the beneficiaries of our collections.

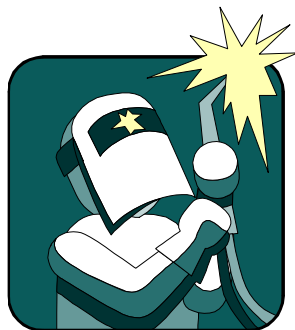
