## Chvatal/Kritzer duo to perform at CJC

**The Chvatal/Kritzer Duo** will perform at the Chipola Theater, Tuesday, **Nov. 14**, at 7 p.m.

Soprano, Janet Chvatal, one of Europe's rising opera celebrities, (and star of the Phantom of the Opera) in Vienna, teams up with top classical guitarist, Scott Kritzer, in a program that will feature North and South American Folk Songs, exotic works from Spain, and beloved opera melodies including the famous "Habanera" from Carmen and Gershwin's "Summertime."

Chvatal, a young coloratura, recently made her first Compact Disc recording under the SONY Label and appeared in a live telecast of "*Famous Scenes from Opera*" for Germany's largest television network ARD; a series which airs to millions of Europeans over the next several seasons. Guitarist Scott Kritzer [pronounced *Crytser*], has performed numerous critically acclaimed recitals on two continents including concerts in New York's Carnegie Recital Hall and Wigmore Hall in London, as well as performances in Los Angeles, San

Francisco, Cincinnati, Las Vegas and Sapporo, Japan. Kritzer recently performed for the California Center for the Performing Arts in Escondido. Other performers on the series included Itzhak Perlman, Ivo Pogorelich, Cecilia Bartoli and the Emerson String Quartet. Kritzer's performance was sold-out eight months in advance.

Two other performances are scheduled in the 2000-01 Chipola Artist Series. **Chicago City Limits**, comedy and improvisation, hits the stage **Jan. 8**. New York's longest running comedy revue Chicago City Limits raises improvisational theatre to an art form. **The Florida Vocal Arts Ensemble** performs **Jan. 30**. Five FSU music faculty members perform folk song arrangements of Beethoven to New American works.

Certified correctional officers interested in training for a career in law enforcement, should contact Chipola Junior College immediately.

Due to the extensive application process, candidates are asked to apply well before the program begins Nov. 1. The 350-hour Cross-over to Law Enforcement academy will run Monday through Friday evenings from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. Estimated

cost is \$625. Completers are eligible to take the state Law Enforcement examination and become certified Peace Officers.

Candidates must be at least 18 years of age, earn a passing score on the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) and meet FDLE requirements.

## Former CJC cheerleader is captain of FSU squad

Former CJC cheerleader Ben Odom is representing CJC and Marianna as captain of the Florida State University Cheerleaders.

Odom, who cheered at CJC in 1998, has been a part of the FSU squad for three years. He cheered with FSU in both of their national title games: the Fiesta Bowl in Tempe, AZ, in 1999 and the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans in 2000.

He helped lead the FSU squad to second place at the National Cheerleading Association competition in 1999.

Odom says, "Cheering just keeps getting better and better. What I like most is the friends you meet—students, alumni and boosters. Cheerleading is like its own co-ed fraternity.

He has travelled to every stadium in the ACC as well as Florida and Miami, and he admits that the first class travel and accommodations are hard to beat. "We sit three rows behind Bobby Bowden on the plane and we get police escorts from the

airport to our hotel and to and from the games," says Odom.

In addition to cheering and academics, Odom finds time to play intramural flag football. His team is headed for the FSU finals.

Of his CJC experience, Odom says, "I enjoyed my time at Chipola. I think it was a good idea to start there, especially for the Gordon Rule classes. The classes are a lot smaller and you can really get to know the teachers. Vikki Milton was a great sponsor/coach, and I really miss Dr. O'Daniel. We got to be pretty good friends while I was there."

Odom, who will graduate with a marketing degree in December, said he is planning a career in sales, probably in the Tampa area. Odom's two sisters, April Alday and Natacha Philips also cheered at CJC. The cheerleading family is headed by Chipola alums, Butch (a former CJC trustee), and Bunny Odom of Marianna.

The Chipola men's and women's basketball teams open their seasons Nov. 3 on the road.

The Indians play a pair of games Nov. 3 and 4 at the Tallahassee Community College Classic.

The Lady Indians open at Hillsborough Community College Nov. 3, then move on to St. Petersburg CC on Nov. 4. The Lady Indians open the home season Nov. 7, as they play host to Darton Community College at 5 p.m.

Both Chipola squads host a huge weekend of basketball action Nov. 10-11, with the Chipola Women's Classic and the Milton H. Johnson Men's Classic. The Lady Indians host Gadsden CC on Nov. 10 at 3:30 p.m., and Daytona on Nov. 11 at 3:30 p.m. North Florida meets Daytona at 1:30, Nov. 10, and Gadsden at 1:30 on Nov. 11.

In the Milton H. Johnson Classic, the Indians host St. John's River at 7:30 p.m. on Nov. 10, and Tyler CC (TX) on Nov. 11 at 7:30 p.m. Tallahassee CC hosts Tyler and St. John's River in the 5:30 preview games on Nov. 10 and 11.

The Indians host the gigantic Panhandle Classic, Nov. 17 and 18, an event almost as big as the state tournament. The ten-game extravaganza tips off at Noon both days and climaxes with Chipola hosting Palm Beach on Nov. 17 at 8 p.m., and Santa Fe on Nov. 18 at 8 p.m. Other visiting teams include Westchester, Cincinnati State, Daytona, Gulf Coast, Okaloosa-Walton, Pensacola and Tallahassee.

Applicants must be at least 19 years of age, be of good moral character and possess a valid

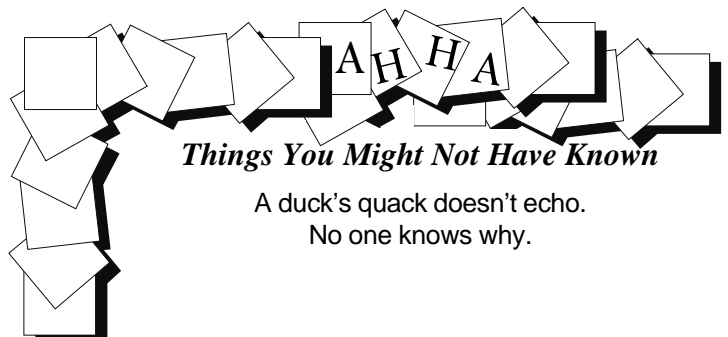
