Students must complete a college application, provide a transcript and proof of measles immunization.

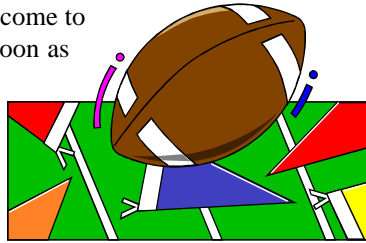
