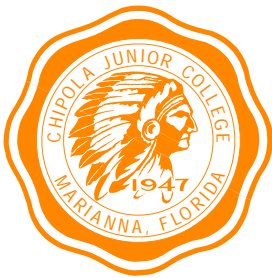

## Chipola approved for \$4.2 million in improvements

According to a state list of community college building projects approved Sept. 11, Chipola students should see many improvements on the campus over the next four years.

Gene Prough, CJC Executive Vice President, presented the 1999-2002 Community Colleges Capital Outlay Project List to the college District Board of Trustees on Sept. 15.

According to the list, Chipola is in line for more than \$4.2 million in remodeling and renovation projects over the next four years. The money will be used to upgrade existing buildings to house new educational programs, and to help the college in meeting ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) guidelines. Other funds are earmarked to enhance utilities, make site improvements and improve roofing.

Projects totaling more than \$1.7 million were approved for 1999-00, including \$483,719 for the Learning Resources Center and \$1,290,000 for Occupational Therapy, Public Service Center and

Workforce Development facilities.

Projects totaling more than \$1.9 million were approved for 2000-01, including \$403,000 for LRC and Workforce Development facilities and \$1.5 million for Nursing, Cosmetology, English facilities.

Projects totaling some \$513,000 were approved for 2001-02 for remodeling, renovation and enhancement of Workforce Development facilities.

Chipola president Dr. Dale O'Daniel says, "We are excited about being able to improve the learning facilities for our students. Executive vice president Gene Prough is to be congratulated for his work in guiding these projects through the process."

Chipola will mark the opening of the newly-constructed Public Service Building Oct. 20. A new English Building also is currently under construction.

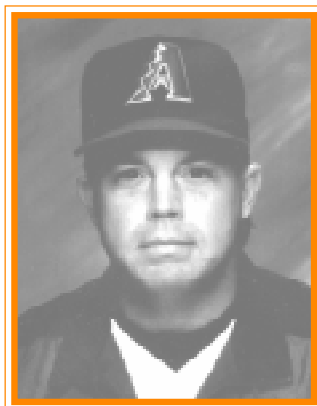
## LASER TAG

## Chipola Indians in the big leagues

CJC alums in pro baseball is Buck Showalter, now in his third season as manager of the Arizona Diamondbacks. The former New York Yankee manager, played at Chipola in 1975. He compiled a 312-269 record with the Yankees and was named AL Manager of the Year in 1994.

Chipola baseball fans are seeing some familiar faces on television these days.

Four former Chipola players are currently in the big leagues, and five other Indians are waiting to be called up from the minors.

Most noteworthy among

Luis Alicea, second baseman for the Texas Rangers, has a .279 batting average this season. The nine-year veteran of pro baseball played at Chipola in 1985.

Bobby Jones, pitcher for the Colorado Rockies, was a product of the 1992 Chipola Indians. He has pitched 39 games in two seasons in the majors, and has thrown 109 strikeouts this season.

Tim Young, a 1994 Chipola player, is the latest Indian to be called up to the big leagues. The Gulfport, MS, native has pitched in five games for the Montreal Expos.

Minor league hopefuls with Chipola ties also include: Gavin Jackson, AAA Pawtucket Red Sox (Boston Red Sox); Adam Faurot, AA El Paso Diablos (Milwaukee Brewers); Jason Green, A Kissimmee Cobras (Houston Astros); Bailey Chancey, AA Binghamton Mets (New York Mets); and Juan Bonilla, R Bluefield Orioles (Baltimore Orioles).

## Small Business Tax Workshop presented by the IRS

The Small Business Development Center and the Internal Revenue Service will co-sponsor a series of workshops entitled, "Small Business Tax Workshops". The courses will be presented by representatives of the IRS and the Florida Department of Revenue. The classes will be held on Sept. 22 and 23, from 6 - 9 p.m. at CJC's Lifelong Learning Center.

tention, sales tax, state unemployment tax, intangible tax, corporate income tax, and information sources for all businesses.

The remainder of the class will cover accounting methods, record keeping and substantiation, payroll taxes and information returns.
