Chipola enrollment up this fall

Enrollment at Chipola is up this Fall by more than ten percent over last year.

Exactly 10.74 percent more students registered during Fall 1999 compared to same period for Fall 1998. Total headcount also is up to 1805 students compared to 1630 for Fall, 1998. Full Time Equivalency (FTE), an average calculation of the number of hours students take, increased 8.5 percent from 437 to 475.

CJC vice president for Academic and Student Services, Charlton Keen, says the increase may be attributed to a number of factors. "We have made a concerted effort to make our programs more accessible to students. We're offer-

ing more classes at more times, and a wider variety of distance learning courses." Keen says the presence of Florida State University's bachelor's degree programs in nursing and information systems at CJC, may also have positively affected enrollment. Many students must take lower level pre-requisites at Chipola to qualify for these four-year programs.

Though CJC classes began Aug. 23, students may continue to register for several Workforce Development programs and Continuing Education courses throughout the semester.

Traffic citations now being issued

Did you know that the speed limit on Chipola's campus is 15 MPH? Did you know that the speed limit on College Street is 25 MPH? If not, this is an important reminder.

The Jackson County Sheriff's Office will be on campus at various times of the day, conducting radar observations. Speeders will be given tickets, and excessive speeding will result in a County Citation which may include several hundred dollars in fines, license points and auto insur-

ance penalties.

Officers may issue tickets for the following violations: speeding, illegal parking, driving the wrong way on one way streets, illegal exits from parking lots, and excessive noise (boom box car stereos).

Failure to pay CJC parking and traffic tickets will result in a hold on registration and access to transcripts.

FSU Coach to visit Chipola Monday

Florida State University head baseball coach Mike Martin will be the guest speaker at Chipola's Fellowship of Christian Athletes meeting on Monday, Sept. 13, at 6:30 p.m., in the Chipola Arts Center.

Martin, who led FSU to the championship game of the 1999 College World Series, is celebrating his 20th season as Florida State's head baseball coach. The Seminole skipper earned his 1,000th victory in 1998.

Winning has not been Martin's only goal in his brilliant career. He believes in making a difference in his players' lives off the field. And teaching the game with his fire and drive has given FSU perhaps the nation's very best all-around college baseball program. Martin has led the Tribe to the CWS ten times in the last 14 years, including eight of the past 11 seasons. During his tenure, 38 different players have earned All-America honors, 72 have been named to all-conference teams and

an incredible 88 players have signed professional contracts.

As a player in 1965-66, Martin hit .354 in two seasons with the Seminoles. He was a part of the 1965 College World Series team, and then went on to play in the New York Mets and Detroit Tigers. Martin began his career as a junior high coach, then he became head basketball coach at Tallahassee Community College and also at Godby High.

A popular speaker, Martin has delivered keynote addresses at several state and national meetings, including gatherings of Atlanta Braves instructional clinics and Seminole booster clubs throughout the Southeast. He is also in demand as a speaker at churches and is active in national and local Fellowship of Christian Athletes activities.

State Board of Community Colleges meets at CJC

The State Board of Community Colleges met on the campus of Chipola Junior College on Friday, Sept. 3.

Among the items discussed was the need for more clear guidelines governing partnerships with four-year universities that offer programs on community college campuses. Florida State University currently offers bachelor's degree programs in nursing and information systems at CJC, and Chipola and officials expect to forge additional partnerships with other universities in the very near future.

The SBCC was established by the Florida Legislature in 1983, to provide general leadership to the Florida Community College System. The board coordinates and oversees the operation of

28 locally-controlled community colleges by: developing statewide policy; reviewing and approving legislative budget requests; and reviewing and evaluating programs.

The SBCC consists of 13 members, including Commissioner of Education Tom Gallagher. The board customarily meets monthly, varying the meeting location among the 28 community colleges in the system.

The SBCC serves as the director of the Division of Community Colleges, within the Florida Department of Education. The executive director of the Florida Community College System, currently David Armstrong, is appointed by the SBCC and serves as executive officer and secretary to the board.

Chipola artist series opens with Cowboy Poet

The Chipola Artist Series opens its 1999-2000 season with Buckaroo Poet Waddie Mitchell on Tuesday, Sept. 21, at 7 p.m.

Mitchell was a real cowboy who became a world-renowned cowboy storyteller and poet, enchanting contemporary audiences with tales of life in the rugged West. Young Bruce Mitchell, nicknamed "Waddie" (a synonym for 'cowboy'), spent most of his time with real cowboys and at night listened to their stories and memorized their poems. He dropped out of school at age 16 to become a full-time wrangler and chuck wagon driver.

While working as the foreman of a ranch, Mitchell appeared in an early-'80s PBS Documentary about the last real cowboys in America, "The Vanishing Breed." The documentary featured some of Mitchell's own poetry, and Johnny Carson invited him to visit "The Tonight Show." Mitchell didn't even know who Carson was, but he was a big hit on the show and later returned several times. He also appeared on several other programs, including Larry King's radio show and a

National Geographic special.

In 1984, he and pal Hal Cannon organized the first Elko Cowboy Poetry Gathering. Two thousand people attended the first year and by 1994, the attendance soared to nearly 14,000. Later in 1984, Mitchell recorded his first album of poetry. His second album sold over 10,000 copies. In 1992, Mitchell was one of the first artists to record on Warner Brothers' newly established Warner Western label with Lone Driftin' Rider.

Mitchell released his second Warner album, Buckaroo Poet, in 1994. He next appeared as a guest host on VH1's "Country, Country" show. He also won numerous honors for his poetry and storytelling, and was inducted into the Cowboy Poets and Singers' Hall of Fame.

Mitchell appeared on the Chipola stage nine years ago to a sell-out audience and is being brought back by popular demand.
