CJC Public Feedback Session is Tuesday

CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel, along with the CJC Governance Council and Accountability Committee, will host a public feedback session on Tuesday, April 25, at 2 p.m., in the college Public Service Building.

Public participation is scheduled from 2 to 3. Students and college employees are asked to speak from 3 to 4 p.m.

O'Daniel held a series of feedback sessions throughout the Chipola district during his first year as president in 1995. He says, "We learned a lot from our previous meetings which I believe helped us to make

Chipola a better college, but it's time for another reality check to be sure we are providing the best educational opportunities for everyone in our district. We hope everyone who has a compliment, comment, or recommendation will attend the session."

The president says he is holding this year's session on campus so students and employees will be able to participate. "As we plan for the future, we need to hear from the people who do the work of the college

as well as the people we serve—both individuals and representatives of business, industry, government, education, and civic organizations," says O'Daniel.

Gail Hartzog, Director of Institutional Effectiveness and Planning at the college, says, "We want to give citizens, students and college employees the opportunity to

voice concerns or praise about Chipola. Our sessions in 1995 included many positive comments, but we also heard some valuable suggestions from a variety of sources about ways to help more students."

Anyone who wishes to express an opinion or suggest an improvement is invited

to attend the session. According to Hartzog, the committee has scheduled several speakers for five-minute presentations, but time will also be allowed for unscheduled speakers to address issues. Hartzog also urges faculty and staff to plan to attend even if schedules mean that they must come late.

CJC Students named to All Florida Academic Team

Chipola Junior College students **Kelly Barfield and Maria Michelle "Shellie" Davis** were recently named to the 2000 All Florida Academic Team.

Selected by the State Board of Community Colleges (SBCC), the two CJC sophomores were among 116 outstanding community and private college students named to the team.

Barfield is the daughter of Dorothy Raines and Carey Barfield of Marianna. She is a graduate of Marianna High. At CJC, she served as editor of the college newspaper, vice president of Student Government and secretary of Student Ambassadors. She also was a member of Phi Theta Kappa, Who's Who and the CJC Honors Program. Barfield plans to major in English at Florida State University.

Davis is the daughter of Jerry and Maria Davis of Ponce De Leon. She is a graduate of Grand Ridge High. At CJC, she was vice president of Science Club and a CJC Cheerleader. She participated in SGA, Student Ambassadors, New Friends and Baptist Campus Ministry. She also was a member of Phi Theta Kappa, Who's Who and the CJC Honors Program. She plans to major in Nutrition at the University of Florida, in preparation for medical school.

An awards luncheon honoring the All Florida team is scheduled for April 27 at the Doubletree Hotel in Tallahassee. The second annual Chipola Junior College/FACC Golf tournament is set for Saturday, April 29, at 8 a.m., at Indian Springs Golf Course in Marianna. An 8:00 a.m. shotgun start is scheduled for the 18-hole event. The format will be a three-person scramble with modified handicapping.

Entry fee is \$60 per person. Registration is limited to 36 teams.

Chipola baseball wraps up season

The Chipola baseball season finished the season with a 31-18 record and a 13-7 league mark with three straight wins over North Florida this week.

In the final game of the season on April 19, Chipola beat North Florida, 5-3. **Drew Miller** led Chipola's offense with two homeruns on the day including a two-run homer in the third and a solo homer in the fifth. Winning pitcher **Justin Lord** pitched seven and two thirds innings. **Blake Taylor** earned the save by pitching the last four outs of the game.

Chipola swept a doubleheader from North Florida on April 18 in Marianna. The Indians won game one, 10-3. Leading hitters for CJC were **Jose Bautista** who was two for four with a solo homer. Drew Miller was two for three with a grand slam in the third to put CJC up 5-2. He logged five RBI's on the day. **Fernando Isa** was three for four. Winning pitcher **David Wolensky** threw six innings and struck out seven to up his record to 9-3. **Nathan Marks** threw the last three innings to earn his first save of the year.

Chipola won game two, 9-7. **Miller** was two for four with a solo homer. **Jake Mathis** was three for five and scored three runs. **Michael Brown** was four for four. **Isa** was one for four with four RBI's.

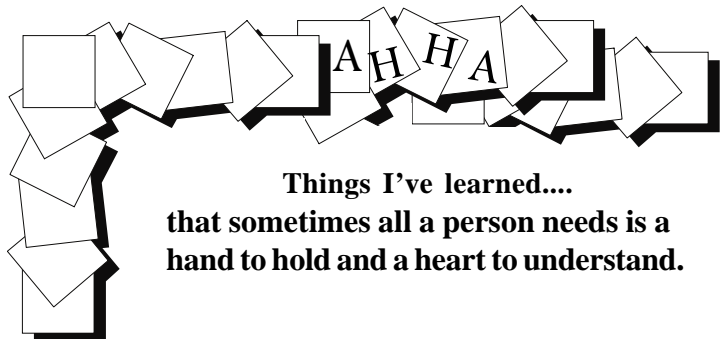
