Throssell Literature/Language Festival slated for April 5

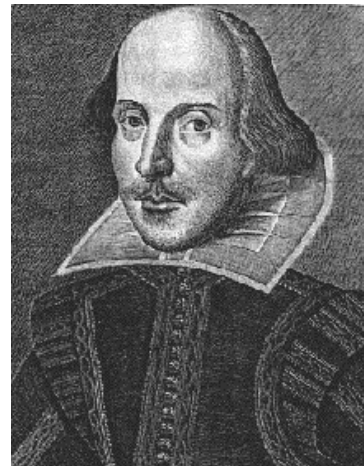
Chipola pleased to announce its Tenth Annual Throssell Literature/Language Festival on Wednesday, April 5.

Roy Beall lives on through CJC Fund

The memory of the late Roy Burns Beall, Sr., longtime Jackson County educator and former award winning coach at Malone School, continues to live on through a scholarship fund at Chipola.

Mrs. Jean Neel, the daughter of "Mr. Roy," as he was known by most Jackson Countians, recently made a substantial contribution to the Chipola Scholarship Fund in honor of his granddaughter Dr. Kitty Myers and her husband Ronnie.

Beall was instrumental in the establishment of Chipola Junior College, as his lifelong vision was to see that the youth of Jackson County had a chance to get an education. Beall started the Valedictorian Scholarship program at Chipola that provides free tuition to the valedictorian of each public high school in the CJC district.

He was Chipola's first basketball coach, and also coached basketball, football and baseball at Malone High School as well as Pony League and American Legion Baseball.

Beall owned and operated a hardware store, service station and tire business in Malone where he sold dry goods, groceries, hardware, furniture, fertilizer, mules, wagons and buggies. He also operated a cotton gin and peanut mill. He began a hardware and implement business in Marianna in 1946, which became a tire business in 1950, Beall Tire Company, which remains a successful enterprise today.

He served on the Jackson County School Board for more than 50 years and on the city commissions of both Malone and Marianna. He taught Sunday School for more than 70 years. He was president of the Marianna Lions Club, and was an Eagle Scout in the Boy Scouts of America. He was voted Jackson County Citizen of the Year in three different decades.

CJC baseball and softball teams doing well in conference

The Chipola Indians baseball team improved to 6-3 in league play with a 6-3 win at North Florida on Tuesday, March 28.

Leading hitter for CJC was **Richie Smith**, who was three for five. **Moises Feliz** was two for four. **Jake Mathis** hit a two-run single, and **Lee Poteet** hit a one run single.

Winning pitcher **Justin Lord** threw four strikeouts and upped his record to 4-4. **Max Havel** came in with two outs in the ninth to strike out one batter and earn the save.

As of March 30, the Indians are 24-14 overall and 6-3 in league play. Chipola's March 29 game with North Florida was postponed due to rain.

The Indians are scheduled to play at Pensacola, April 1 and to host PJC, April 2 at 1 p.m.

Chipola travels to South Georgia, April 4 and to Gulf Coast, April 7. The Indians host Gulf Coast on April 8 at 1 p.m. Chipola's conference baseball games are broadcast by Deep South Sports on WJAQ-Radio, FM-100.9.

The Lady Indians Softball team split a pair of games with North Florida on Tuesday, March 28. CJC won game one, 5-3, and dropped game two, 3-0. Gin Sewel was two for three in game one. Winning pitcher in game one was **Tanya Teague**. The team's record is 34-10. The Lady Indians host Tallahassee, April 1 at 1 p.m., Okaloosa-Walton, April 4 at 4 p.m.

Chipola pool to open in April

The CJC Pool is set to open the second week of April.

Pool admission is \$2 per person per day. Season passes are available and are good for all leisure pool hours from April through September. Individual passes are \$45. Family passes are \$75 for two or three persons; \$85 for four or five persons; \$25 additional for each person more than five. Swim Team passes are \$80 for parents and one child, and \$120 for parents and two or more children.

American Red Cross Lifeguard training classes are now available. The weekend class will meet Saturdays, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., and Sundays from Noon to 4 p.m., April 1 to April 16. An evening class will meet Monday through Thursday evenings, from 4 to 8:30 p.m., May 1 to May 11. The certification is good for three years, and includes CPR for the Professional Rescuer, which is valid for one year.

The American Red Cross Learn to Swim Program will be offered for all ages and levels of swimming ability. Each session includes eight 45-minute lessons. Fee for each session of group lessons is \$35. Classes are offered at 9 a.m., 10 a.m., and 7:15 p.m. Session 1 is May 22 to June 1. Session 2 is June 5-15. Session 3 is June 19-29. Session 4 is July 10-20. Session 5 is July 24 through August 3.

The Marianna Swim Team competes in five invitational swim meets for swimmers 4-18 years of age. The season begins in April and ends the first week in August. Marianna hosts the Chipola Invitational swim meet in July. Swim team practice is 5:30 to 7 p.m. Monday through Thursday.

James Thurber to visit Chipola

Humorist James Thurber (1894-1961) will come to life in a performance at Chipola on Monday, April 17, at 11 a.m.

Thurber was most famous for his writings in *The New Yorker*, where he shaped the style of what became the nation's preeminent humor magazine. Known for his outrageous cartoons and gentle humor at his own expense, Thurber wrote such classics as *The Secret Lives of Walter Mitty*, *The Seal in the Bedroom* and *The Fables for Our Time*.

Thurber is portrayed by Carrol Peterson, senior professor of English at Doane College in Crete Nebraska. A veteran of the Great Plains Chautauqua, Peterson has also presented Thomas Paine, Walt Whitman and Jack London.

Audience members will also have the oppor-

tunity to talk with the scholar when he steps out of character to discuss his ideas on this important historical figure.

A total of \$875 in prize money will be awarded: \$300 for the first place team, \$225 for second and \$150 for third. Special prizes will be awarded for longest drive on 1 and 17, and closest to pin on 8 and 18.

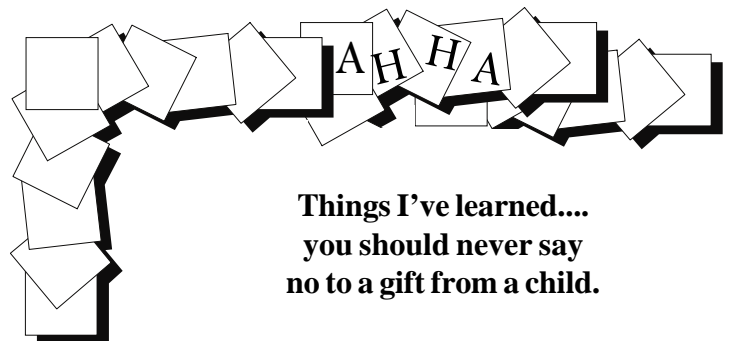
