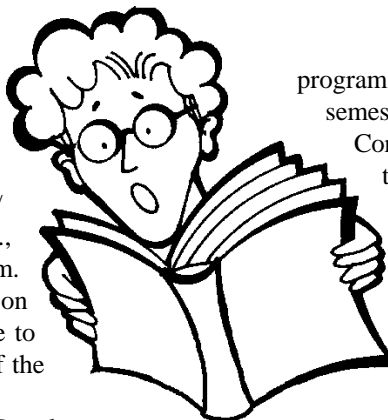

Chipola Artist Series opens tenth season

A flower girl, a band, opera singers and a pianist are starring players in the 1998-99 'Let Us Entertain You' Artist Series at Chipola Junior College, announced today by Executive Director Joan Stadskev.

The four-event series opens Sept. 24 with George Bernard Shaw's comedic masterpiece, "Pygmalion," the satirical tale of an English professor who transforms a cockney flower girl into a dazzling society lady.

On Oct. 6 Florida's highly-praised St. John's River City Band will present an instrumental and vocal entertainment, "The Magic of Broadway."

Arriving Jan. 14 is the popular Orlando Opera Company for a performance of their family musical gala, "Love and Laughter."

The series ends Feb. 23 with a concert by internationally-acclaimed pianist Frank Weins that critics call "brilliant and dazzling."

All performances are at 7 p.m. in the Chipola Theatre. Season tickets go on sale Sept. 1 and are \$40 for all four events. These special tickets

entitle the holders to reserved orchestra seats, invitations to a "Meet The Artist" post-performance reception, a quarterly arts calendar and early ticket-renewal next year. For season tickets, call the CJC Fine & Performing Arts Department at 718-2277.

A limited number of individual event tickets will be available two weeks prior to each performance in the college Book Store (718-2258) at \$12 for adults and \$8 for ages 18 and under.

According to Stadskev, the Chipola Artist Series is celebrating its Tenth Anniversary this season. "For this special occasion we chose the slogan "Let Us Entertain You," to emphasize our new campaign to bring more people to series events and to the variety of theatre, show choir and symphony performances on campus," she added.

The series is sponsored in part by the Florida Department of State, Division of Cultural Affairs and the Florida Arts Council.

FCE-LPT TESTING

The CJC Testing Office will offer the Florida College Entry Level Placement Test (FCE-LPT) through Wednesday, **Aug. 26**. The test will be offered at **8:00 a.m., 10:30 a.m., and 1:30 p.m.** in the Testing Lab in Student Services (G).

Students will be required to show a photo ID to be admitted. The fee is \$15, or \$5 per subtest.

Students must wait at least 90 days before taking the test a second time. Students must wait at least two years after the second administration to take the test a third time.

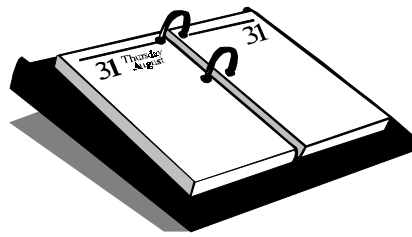
