Chipola hoops to play final games of regular season

The Lady Indians moved a little closer to a possible spot in the state tournament with a 62-48 win at Pensacola on Feb. 15.

Charrisse Hill led Chipola with 14. Tina Stapleton scored 13, and Sheherah Clark added 10. The Lady Indians improved to 8-5 in the league, and 19-9 overall.

With two games remaining, the Lady Indians are in the driver's seat to earn a spot in the state tournament. CJC were scheduled to host Okaloosa on Feb. 19, and to play at TCC on Feb. 21. As of Feb. 17, Gulf Coast leads the conference at 11-2. Chipola is second at 8-5. Tallahassee and Okaloosa-Walton are tied for third at 7-6. Pensacola is 6-7 and North Florida 0-12. The top two teams in the league will earn a berth to the state tournament, and due to some reorganization in women's leagues, the number three women's Panhandle team is expected to make it to the state tournament with an at-large berth.

Chipola's Tina Stapleton, of Blakely, GA, was selected as Honorable Mention Player of the Week for the State. Stapleton scored 43 points and had 21 rebounds in Chipola's wins over North Florida on Feb. 8 and Gulf Coast Feb. 12. She is the state's tenth leading scorer with a 15.3 average. She is eleventh in rebounding with a 9.12 average.

The Indians suffered an 87-77 overtime loss at Pensacola on Tuesday which put CJC out of contention for post season play. Janerio Spurlock led CJC with 25 points. Marcelle Davis scored 13 and Will Campbell added 10.

As of Feb. 17, Okaloosa-Walton leads the men's conference race at 7-3. TCC is second at 7-4. Pensacola is third at 6-5. Chipola is 4-6 and Gulf Coast is 2-8.

Though the Indians are out of contention for state, they have the opportunity to play a spoiler role

when they travel to Tallahassee for their final game of the season on Feb. 21.

Head coach Ryan Cross says he's proud of his team's accomplishments. "I'm please with how hard our guys have worked. Last year's team won only 14 games and we've already won 19 this season with two games left. Our players have done more than we could have expected." The Indians are ranked eighth in the state. Janerio Spurlock is the state's sixth leading scorer with a 19 point average. Will Campbell leads the state in rebounds with a 12.93 average. Michael Hardaway is first in assists with an 11.27 average, and fifth in steals with a 2.92 average.

Cross says he's proud of his sophomores, especially Mike Hardaway and Marcelle Davis, the only two returnees from last year's squad. "They've led us to a very successful season." Hardaway is looking to move to the next level, with recruiting interest from Georgia Southern, Northeast Louisiana State, Appalachian State, San Jose State and others. Davis is being recruited by New Orleans, Southwest Texas, Stetson, Middle Tennessee, George Mason and Loyola.

Cross already is busy reloading for next season. He says, "We're involved with a lot of good high school players. We're looking at some local players and working the Southeast. We're considering kids from all over the country, but we're focusing on quality kids from this area that can come and fit into our program. I think we've laid some good groundwork for our program." Two of CJC's top freshmen—Janerio Spurlock and David Howell—will return next season.

State tourney begins March 1

Eight men's teams and eight women's teams will compete for the 2000 Florida Community College Activities Association Basketball championship at Chipola, March 1-4.

Chipola was the site of the first state tourney in 1961. Chipola hosted that tourney at the school's old Field House, and coach Jim Pavy's Indians won the state title with a 65-56 victory over Manatee. Chipola has won seven state titles—more than any Florida school. The men's tournament returned to CJC in 1996 after 35 years. Chipola hosted the first ever, combined men's and women's tournament in 1997, and then again in 1998 and 1999.

Four women's teams have clinched spots to the tourney: Gulf Coast, Miami Dade, Palm Beach and Daytona Beach. The Chipola Lady Indians are currently second in the Panhandle Conference and are hopeful of a tournament berth. Only two men's teams have clinched: Brevard and Pasco-Hernando.

This year's tournament begins Wednesday, March 1, with four first round men's games. The af-

ternoon session features games at 1:00 p.m. and 3:00 p.m. Games for the evening session are set at 6:00 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Women's action begins Thursday, March 2, with four first round games at 1:00, 3:00, 6:00 and 8:00.

Friday, March 3 begins with a men's semi-final game at 1 p.m., followed by a women's semi at 3:00 p.m. The evening session on Friday, will include a men's semi-final matchup at 6 p.m. and a women's semi at 8 p.m.

The men's championship game is slated for 5:00 p.m. on March 4, followed by the men's championship at 7:30 p.m.

Tournament passes—\$25 for adults and \$15 for students—will get fans into all 14 exciting tournament games. Single session tickets are \$10 each. Tickets are also available at the CJC Business Office.

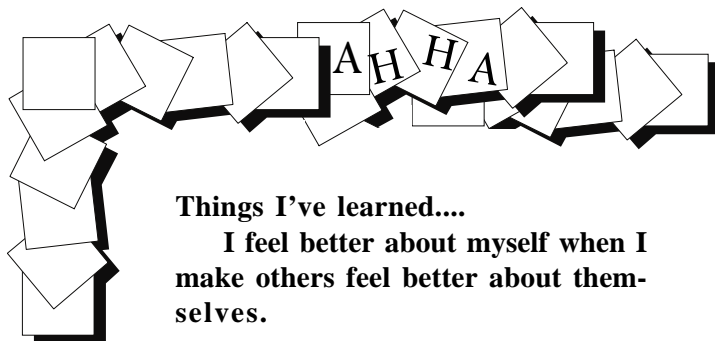
The exhibit is open to the public weekdays from 8 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Group visits may be arranged by phoning 718-2301.
