Summer camps begin this week

Chipola will offer a number of programs and camps for area youth this summer.

Kids' College is set for June 5-June 15 (Session I) and again June 19-June 29 (Session II). Both sessions have morning camps from 9 a.m. to Noon and afternoon camps from 1-4 p.m. Early drop-off and late pick-up is available.

STW WORKSHOP

The Region Four School-to-Work/Tech Prep Annual Workshop is June 6-7 at Blue Springs Baptist Assembly.

The two-day program is designed to provide information to public school teachers, administrators, and business partners. Local players sign with CJC

The Chipola women's basketball program has signed two Malone High graduates and a Grand Ridge High graduate.

Grand Ridge High graduate D'Leisha Cockerham averaged 20 points and 5.7 rebounds per game during her senior season. She also averaged 3.3 steals and 1.5 assists. Cockerham also shot 78 percent from the free throw line and averaged two three-pointers per game. She is a Bright Futures Scholar, and graduated third in her high school class.

Chipola women's head coach Jason Keene says, "D'Leisha shoots the ball very well. She's very knowledgeable of the game and she's an excellent student. I look for her to have two great years at Chipola, and with a little work on her ball-handling skills she could leave here and go on to the next level." Cockerham reportedly chose Chipola over Tallahassee and Gulf Coast Community Colleges.

Malone graduates Satoya Spates and Temecca Barnes, who led Malone to a 27-5 mark and the Regional Finals, also signed with CJC. Spates

played most every position for the Tigers. She averaged 19 points, 8 rebounds, 5 assists and 2 steals per game. An All District pick since eighth grade, Spates was first team All State in 1999 and All Big Bend in 2000. Keene says, Spates is a very good shooter. She will improve her ball-handling and gain some intensity for the college game, but she is probably division level right now." She was recruited by all four Panhandle Conference teams, but ultimately chose CJC over Gulf Coast.

Barnes averaged 17 points, 7 rebounds and 5 steals per game. She was an All State pick in 1999 and Big Bend Honorable Mention last season. Keene says, "Barnes is very quick and a very good defender. She needs to work on her ball-handling and shooting a little, but she is a very good athlete." She also was being recruited by Pensacola and Okaloosa-Walton.

The three players are Keene's first recruits since he took over the CJC women's program on May 22.

FSU Nursing meeting at Chipola is Monday

Florida State University will hold an information session on Monday, June 5, at 6 p.m. in the Chipola Junior College Natural Science Building, Room D300.

FSU currently offers a Bachelor of Nursing degree on the Chipola campus. The program allows licensed RN's to earn B.S. and M.S. degrees on the Chipola campus. Any RN or prospective RN who has an interest in pursuing a BSN degree should attend.

Florida A & M University will host a meeting Tuesday, June 13, at 5:30 p.m. in the Natural Science Building, D300. FAMU will offer a B.S. in Social Work and additional courses leading to a master's degree in social work.

This Fall the University of West Florida will begin bachelor's degree programs in Special/Elementary Education and Criminal Justice. Both UWF programs and FSU's nursing program will have on-campus coordinators. FSU/FAMU Col-

lege of Engineering has plans to offer the third year of core engineering courses at Chipola and Troy State University at Dothan has made a preliminary commitment to begin at least two business degrees, including MIS. FSU/PC will offer an Information Studies/Management on-line degree and will place a faculty member on-campus two or three days a week to assist students. Other, on-line, degrees are also available.

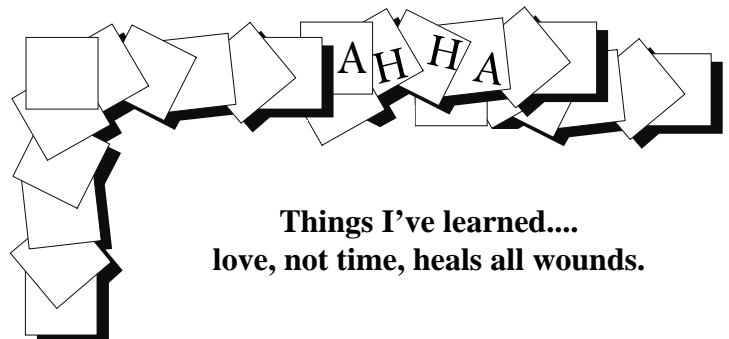
