Alice in Wonderland is Thursday at CJC

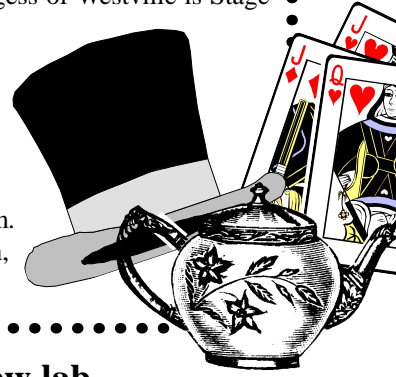
The timeless story of "Alice in Wonderland" will come alive on the Chipola Junior College stage on **Thursday, May 11 at 7:30 p.m.**

The Chipola Junior College District Board of Trustees and college president Dr. Dale O'Daniel invite the public to a Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony to celebrate the opening of the college's new Literature/Language Building and Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) Laboratory on **Tuesday, May 16**, beginning at 2 p.m.

Tours of the OTA Laboratory will be given beginning at 2 p.m. Ribbon-cutting and tours of the Literature/Language Building begin at 2:30 p.m.

A number of dignitaries are expected to be on

hand for the event, which will include a reception and guided tours.

The 30,000 square-foot Literature/Language building includes the college's first full-service elevator, internet-ready classrooms and a covered patio area for students. The building will house the college's Arts and Letters Division that offers courses in English, foreign language, humanities and literature.

The OTA lab consists of 12 state-of-the-art computers, practice area, training kitchen and bathroom.
