Mark Twain to visit Chipola

Mark Twain, humorist, riverboat pilot and author will come to life in a presentation at Chipola on Monday, Nov. 15, at 11 a.m.

Twain will be portrayed by George Frein, recently retired University of North Dakota Professor Emeritus of Philosophy and Religion. He is director of the National Chautauqua Tour, a group of humanities scholars who offer programs of historical characterization nationwide. Frein will share the works of Twain and then open a discussion for audience questions. Participants will also have the opportunity to talk with the scholar when he steps out of character to discuss his ideas on this important historical figure.

Chautauqua (shuh-taw-kwa) began in 1874 on the banks of Lake Chautauqua in up-state New York and has developed into a thoughtful, educational, entertaining event.

Core Ensemble to present Harlem Renaissance Era

On Thursday, Nov. 18 at 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. in the CJC Theatre, the Core Ensemble, with actor Akin Babatunde, will perform a new musical theatre piece, "*Of Ebony Embers*," subtitled "*Vignettes of the Harlem Renaissance*."

The work celebrates the music and poetry of African Americans in New York City during the 1920's. The 50-minute piece explores the life and times of African Americans who helped shape the Harlem Renaissance. The performance examines the lives of three outstanding but very different African American poets—Langston Hughes, Countee Cullen and Claude McKay—as seen through the eyes of the great painter and muralist Aaron Douglas. All four characters will be interpreted by Babatunde who is nationally known for his regular appearances on Public Television's children's show *Wishbone*. *The Dallas Observer*

Lady Indians bring experience to 1999-2000 season

The Chipola Lady Indians will line up an experienced squad when they tip off their season at the Chipola Classic, Nov. 12 and 13 in Marianna.

The team hosts Darton on Nov. 12 at 5:30 p.m., and Daytona on Nov. 13 at 3:30 p.m.

The Lady Indians are expecting a great season with experienced players at every position. Ten players on this year's roster have competed for one season in conference play, and with last year's redshirt freshman, Carrie Titus, eleven players on the roster have plenty of college experience. The young Lady Indians of a year ago won 19 games.

Head coach Hilary Allen says, "The back court appears to be the strength for our team. Graceville favorite Sheherah Clark will return at point guard. Her speed will present problems for the opponents again this year." Tina Stapleton returns at guard after a one-year absence. She led CJC in scoring during the 97-98 season, and was voted the team's Most Valuable Player. Clark and Stapleton garnered First Team All-Conference honors as freshmen.

Several shooting guards return for their sophomore season. Shannon O'Connor started in 28 of 30 games last year. Marianna twins Lacy

and Tracy Tolbert combine both speed and shooting ability. Marianna's Charrisse Hill should get playing time at both the guard and forward positions. Tamika Holsey has shown promise at point guard and shooting guard. Two freshmen, Dorcas Ocampo of Bonifay and Keisha Thornton, are working hard to earn playing time. Hilary Taylor of Holmes County High and Dena Triplett have nagging injuries that have slowed their progress.

Quality players make up the Lady Indians' front court as well, with seven players over six feet tall. Keelee Traylor had a strong freshman season, averaging over 12 rebounds per game to finish second in the state rankings. Tina Stapleton, Rena Jones, and Tiffany Davis should add scoring ability to the team. The team's tallest player Carrie Titus, 6'2, sat out last year with a knee injury, but she has worked hard at her recovery. As the team's tallest player, she will be called upon to play defense. Two freshmen, Danika Cayruth and Jennifer McGlynn, should add depth at the post slot.

Burns contributes to national curriculum guidelines

CJC computer science instructor Nancy Burns recently received word of publication of a paper which she helped to produce, entitled, "Curriculum Guidelines for Two-Year Degree and Certificate Programs to Support Computing in a Networked Environment."

The work is the product of a Task Force convened by the Two-Year College Education Committee of the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM) Special Interest Group for Computer Science Education, and is to be published electronically on the ACM web site at www.acm.org.

The Task Force, which initially met in June

1998, was composed of industry professionals and computer science educators. Burns and three other Task Force members presented the paper at the Thirtieth Annual Technical Symposium of the ACM in New Orleans earlier this year. ACM is the oldest organization of computing professionals in the world. With more than 80,000 professionals and students worldwide, the ACM is considered an authority in the computing world. Burns has taught a number of computing courses at Chipola for the past 12 years, and has been involved with curriculum development at the local and state level in Florida.
