Prince and the Pauper to visit Chipola Friday

Chipola athletic program fares well on state report

Chipola's student athletes performed well on the 1998-99 Florida Community College Activities Association Academic Report.

According to the report, of Chipola's 23 second-year athletes, a total of 15, or 65 percent graduated. Some 19, or 82 percent, transferred to four-year colleges, and 15, or 65 percent are on athletic scholarships.

Chipola's graduation rate is above both the

conference average and the state average. CJC's percentage of transfers is below the conference average, but above the state average. Chipola's percentage of students receiving athletic aid also is above both the conference average and the state average.

Chipola offers intercollegiate athletic programs in men's and women's basketball, softball and baseball.

Miller presents at national meeting

CJC counselor Joan Miller presented an Exemplary Practice seminar on the Chipola student advising system at the National Council on Student Development in Kansas City, MO, on Sept. 27.

Miller was one of only 18 experts in the field chosen from across the country. Her presentation highlighted the evolution of Chipola's faculty-based advising system and the creation of the Chipola Advising Manual.

Miller was invited to attend the national conference after making the presentation in the Exemplary Practice competition at the 1999 Florida Association of Community Colleges Convention.

For her efforts, Miller was presented "The

Shared Journey Finalist Award," given in honor of Terry O'Banion, Executive Director of the League for Innovation in the Community College in Laguna Hills, CA, who is retiring this year. O'Banion, a well-known consultant and author, is also a Distinguished Professor at the University of Texas; University of Illinois, was Chancellor of the Dallas County Community College District, and served as Dean of Students at both Central Florida and Santa Fe Community Colleges.

Miller has been invited to make the presentation at the regional meeting of the National Academic Advising Association in Biloxi, MS, in March. She is a doctoral candidate in Educational Leadership at the Florida State University.

Chipola to host film and discussion on race relations

The Chipola Social Science department is hosting a campus wide activity the week of October 4-8 aimed at bridging the racial divides that exist on campuses nationwide.

Associate Dean, Dr. Rene Tharpe, says, "We hope to affect progress on this front by sponsoring a documentary type film and discussion. The film, entitled "Blue Eyed," will be shown Tuesday, Oct. 5, at 2 p.m. in D-300. The film will be

followed on by an open discussion of overt and covert forms of racism on Wednesday, Oct. 6, at 10 a.m. in C-15.

Tharpe says, "The objective is not just to identify racist attitudes and actions but identify cultural beliefs rooted in ignorance that sustain racism and divide society."

Scholars of London to play Chipola Oct. 11

The Scholars of London, a classical unaccompanied vocal quartet, will perform at the Chipola Junior College Theater on Monday, Oct. 11, at 7 p.m.

Hailed as one of the world's musical treasures, The Scholars offer sparkling and entertaining performances of music spanning five centuries. But the show is not music alone, the British quartet is known for their comedic flair. In fact the Albany (NY) *Times Union* reported that "Chevy Chase would not be out of place as a Scholar, if he had the voice."

The British unaccompanied quartet has given at least 2,500 concerts in more than 50 countries since their debut in 1970, a record that can be rivaled by very few ensembles in the field of chamber music.

They have performed in many of the world's most famous concert halls, from New York's Lincoln Center, London's Royal Festival Hall and the Sydney Opera House to smaller, more intimate venues such as Wigmore Hall in London and the Brahmsaal in Vienna. Their sparkling perfor-

mances, enlivened by humorous commentary, are acclaimed by critics and audiences alike.

The name "Scholars" derives from the fact that the original members of the group all won scholarships to Cambridge University to sing in the famous choir of King's College Chapel. Thus the Scholars of London began as an all-male ensemble, but as early as 1972 the group changed to include a female voice, adding a new dimension to both sound and repertoire. David van Asch and Robin Doveton are both founding members while Kym Amps and Angus Davidson joined the group in 1983 and 1986 respectively.

The performance is the second of four offerings in the Chipola Artist Series. On Feb. 28, the British duo Double Exposure, will perform Baroque, classical, and romantic masterpieces. The series ends with a true classic of American literature "To Kill a Mockingbird" on March 30.
