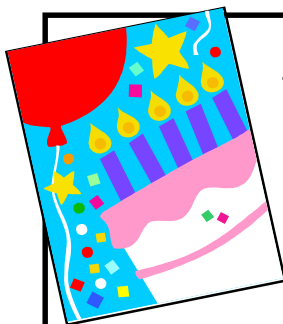

Networking degree offered at CJC

Students interested in the field of computer networking should contact Chipola Junior College immediately.

Chipola's newly-revised Networking Services Technology program is now accepting students for the Spring Semester. This Associate in Science (AS) degree program focuses on computer systems and network support. Courses cover a broad set of skills and knowledge in computer network administration. The program provides training for recognized industry certifications including A+ and Network+, as well as the core courses for Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer (MCSE).

The purpose of the two-year program is to prepare students for employment as information technology specialists, network control operators, data analysts, network technicians, computer security specialists, network specialists, network managers, microcomputer technicians, troubleshooters, WAN/LAN managers, or systems administrators.

Vikki Milton, Chipola's Networking Services Technology advisor, says, "Individuals who can design, manage, and support computer networks are crucial in today's technological environment.

Specialists in the IT field are currently demanding high salaries with companies across the country. Similar certification programs can cost thousands of dollars, while our AS degree program offers the same instruction for the standard tuition of \$50 per semester hour." Financial aid is available to those who qualify.

Three courses are scheduled for the Spring Semester. Introduction to Microcomputer Maintenance and Repair (CET 1171) will be offered Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 8 a.m. to 8:50 a.m. Introduction to Networks and Communication (CGS 1263) will be offered Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 9:50 a.m. Introduction to LAN Management (CGS 1550) will be offered Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, from 10 a.m. to 10:50 p.m. Other general education courses required for The Networking Service degree will also be offered during the Spring semester.

Students are encouraged to meet with an advisor as soon as possible to make arrangements for the Spring semester. Registration is Jan. 2 and 3. Classes begin Jan. 4. For information, contact Vikki Milton at 526-2761, Ext. 3371.

Chipola hoops squads doing well at break

The **Chipola Indians** improved to 10-2 with a big 85-60 win over Atlanta Metro on Dec. 1.

Brandon Freeman led Chipola with 22 points. Kareem Johnson scored 19. John Andrews had 12, and Michael Wilds added 10. Chipola travels to South Georgia Tech on Dec. 8.

Chipola is currently ranked 22nd in National NJCAA poll. The Indians are number three in the state poll behind OW at number one, and PJC at number two.

The Indians will play second-ranked Barton County (Kansas) in the first round of the Dixie Invitational in St. George, Utah, Dec. 27-29. Chipola head coach Ryan Cross was head coach Barton County in 1999. Other nationally ranked teams in the tournament include Dixie State College at number 4, and Utah Valley State College at number 13.

Brandon Freeman leads Chipola's offense and is currently the leading scorer in the Panhandle conference with 17.3 points per game. He also leads the state in three-point field goals with 44 in 12 games

Wayne Bransom is the second best

rebounder in the conference, averaging 10.5 rebounds per game. He also is averaging 9.3 points per contest. Kareem Johnson is averaging 11.9 points and 10.4 rebounds per game, placing him third in the league rebounding race. John Andrews is averaging 12.5 points and 10.5 rebounds. David Hilton is averaging 7.8 points and 5.1 assists.

Chipola women's basketball team improved to 7-4 with a 78-53 win over Darton College on Dec. 4. Tamecca Barnes led Chipola with 19 points. Rebecca Montz and Takesha Oden each scored 12. The Lady Indians had 22 steals and forced 30 turnovers. Satoya Spates had 10 rebounds, 5 steals, and 7 assists. Montz, at only 5'5, had 6 offensive rebounds. Barnes had 8 rebounds, 4 assists and 6 steals.

The Lady Indians play Wallace @ Hanceville and Chattanooga in the OW Classic on Dec. 7-8 in Niceville. The Lady Indians return from the holiday break to play in the New Year Classic at Gulf Coast on Dec. 29 and 30.

Changes announced for CJC Nursing Program

The Board of Nursing recently approved significant curriculum changes for the Chipola Junior College Nursing Programs.

Students will now be admitted to the nursing program, both practical and associate degree (RN), together for the first year. All students will be required to take pre-requisite courses prior to entry. The pre-requisites include MAT 1033 or MAC 1105, General psychology, and ENC 1101. To be able to take the anatomy and physiology the first semester in the program as planned, students should either take BSC 1005 or receive departmental approval to take BSC 2093 without BSC 1005.

The new program allows students to take the BSC 2093, BSC 2094, and microbiology while in the

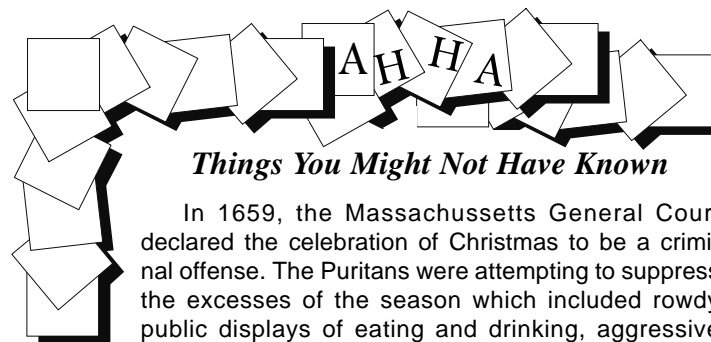
program, rather than prior to acceptance as was the case in the previous program. Additionally, the students ALL will be eligible to take the NCLEX-PN licensure exam following completion of the third semester in the program. CJC students may then proceed in the program for two additional semesters and receive an associate of nursing degree and then be eligible to take the NCLEX-RN licensure exam.

The program will begin admitting two classes per year, one in the fall and again in the spring, thus offering all nursing courses twice per year for the first time! Also, total enrollment has been increased so that both fall and spring a class of 40 students can be accepted!

**Things You Might Not Have Known**

In 1659, the Massachusetts General Court declared the celebration of Christmas to be a criminal offense. The Puritans were attempting to suppress the excesses of the season which included rowdy public displays of eating and drinking, aggressive begging and boisterous invasions.
