FACTS provides online services to college students

A unique, new website, www.facts.org, offers nearly 1 million Florida college students a complete one-stop assortment of support services designed to meet academic advising needs.

FACTS (Florida Academic Counseling and Tracking for Students) posts information about the state's 11 state universities, 28 community colleges and 27 independent colleges and universities. The site offers quick, efficient

access to services

that used to be available only through the counselor's office. Now with no lines, no waiting, students can find

help 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Chipola plans to use FACTS to distribute grades to students online, saving an estimated \$6,000 in mailing costs.

FACTS.org can help with:

• **Academic advising.** Students can perform degree audits to assess progress, and to check requirements for transferring to other colleges.

• **Transcripts.** Students can access transcripts to check grades and chart degrees on-line.

• **Choosing a college.** With links to 66 institutions, students can get information about Florida colleges and universi-

ties at a single stop.

• **Picking a major.** Students can search programs of study by subject area, institution or degree level, locating the Florida institutions that offer desired programs.

• **College admissions.** Using a common application form, students can apply to one or more institutions on-line at the same time; obtain information on fees and; at some institutions, pay tuition and fees on-line

• **Financial aid information.** FACTS links to state, federal and private financial aid sites where stu-

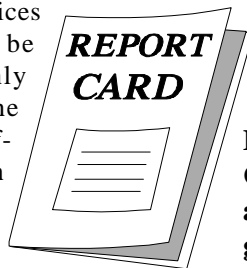
Effective Fall 2001 CJC students will be able to access their grades via the internet. dents can process financial aid applications on-line. In the future students will be able to assess

• **Career guidance.** Students can get statewide access to the eCHOICES and SIGI PLUS websites, for the best career counseling options.

FACTS is administered by the Florida Center for Advising and Academic Support. The administrative staff is provided by the Department of Education in Tallahassee, and the technical staff is located at the University of South Florida in Tampa.

New students planning to enroll at Chipola Junior College in the Spring 2002 Semester are encouraged to make application by the Dec. 7 deadline.

New students must complete an application and provide high school or college transcripts.

Chipola offers hundreds of college credit courses during the day and evening, and also through independent study. The college offers the Associate in Arts (AA) degree which guarantees acceptance to Florida's public universities. Chipola also offers several Associate in Science (AS) pro-

grams, as well as a number of Workforce Development programs which provide training for high wage jobs.

Chipola's University Center provides opportunities for students to pursue a number of bachelor's and advanced degrees on the CJC campus.

Registration for the Spring Semester is Jan. 2 for returning students and Jan. 3 for new students. Classes begin Jan. 4.

Lady Indians host Darton Tuesday

The Lady Indians host Darton College, Tuesday, Dec. 4 at 5 p.m., in the Johnson Health Center. The Lady Indians defeated Darton 68-59 on Nov. 27. Tameka Barnes led CJC with 15 points. Takesha Oden scored 14.

The Indians improved to 8-2 with an 81-62 win over South Georgia Tech on Nov. 27.

Three CJC players—Wayne Bransom, Brandon Freeman and Kareem Johnson—scored 15 points each. Head coach Ryan Cross says, "It was a good team victory for us. Everybody played. Everyone played quality minutes and we really bounced back from

a disappointing loss last week and played pretty well as a team. We got an opportunity to play some of our younger guys. It was a good win for us."

The Indians are off to a strong start with a number three-ranking in the state poll.

Chipola advanced to the championship round of the Pepsi Invitational Tournament in Ocala, before falling to Palm Beach, 72-55, on Nov. 24. David Hilton led CJC with 15 points. Brandon

Freeman scored 11. Chipola scored a 63-61 second round win over Central Florida on Nov. 23. Freeman led with 17. The Indians outlasted Spartanburg Methodist, 86-79, in the first round on Nov. 22. Kareem Johnson had 18 points and 14 rebounds. Wayne Bransom had 13 points and 14 rebounds.

Freeman leads the Indians in scoring with a 17 point-per-game average. Bransom is the state's

sixth best rebounder, averaging 9.2 grabs per game. Johnson is averaging 8.7 rebounds per game. Michael Wilds is averaging 7.2 grabs per contest. In assists, Dominique Townes is averaging 4.8

per game. Hilton is averaging 4.5.

The Indians were scheduled to play at the Okaloosa-Walton Classic, Nov. 30 and Dec. 1. CJC plays at South Georgia Tech on Dec. 8. The team travels to the Dixie Invitational in St. George, Utah, Dec. 27-29. Chipola hosts the Milton H. Johnson Classic, Jan. 4-5.

Chipola baseballers sign with major colleges

Four Chipola Junior College baseball players recently signed scholarship deals with four-year colleges.

Kyle Pawelczyk of Elkins, West Virginia signed with Louisiana State University. The 6'5 left handed pitcher compiled a 2-0 mark last season with 2 saves and an impressive 1.82 ERA and 36 strikeouts.

Ricardo Nanita of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic signed with Florida International University. The left-handed outfielder led the Chipola offense last season with a .385 batting average, including 48 RBI's, 5 homeruns, and 17 doubles.

Johnny Lynch of Rogers, Minnesota signed

with the University of South Alabama. The left-handed pitcher was 2-2 last season, with 3 saves and 36 strikeouts.

Infielder **Russell Martin** of Montreal, Canada signed with North Carolina State University. Martin was a key contributor to the CJC offense last season with a .304 batting average, including 51 hits and 47 runs scored.

The 2001 Indians captured the Panhandle Conference Championship, finished second in FCCAA State Baseball Championship and compiled a 43-16 overall record. Head coach Jeff Johnson has led the Indians to the state tourney three of his five seasons at Chipola.

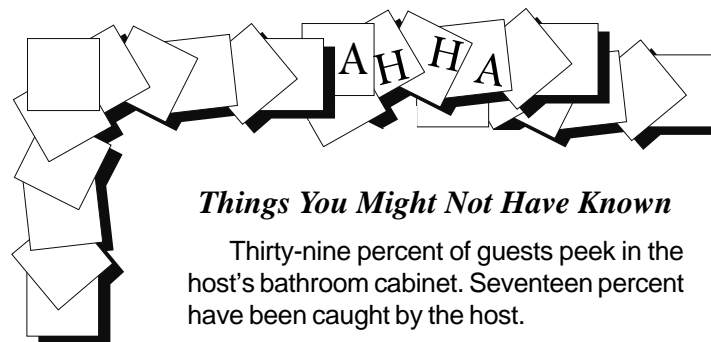
* *SPECIAL NOTE**: Any conflicts should be resolved between student and instructor.
