Molineux's work performed at composer's conference

A musical composition by Dr. Allen Molineux, a member of Chipola Junior College's Fine Arts Department, was recently selected for performance at the Society of Composers' Region V Conference at Ball State University in Muncie, IN, Feb. 8-10 in conjunction with the school's "Festival 31: New Music 2001."

Molineux's composition entitled, "Lachrymae for Brass Quintet," was among 40 works selected from hundreds submitted from across the country. Molineux's composition was performed by the Da Camera Brass Quintet which is made up of faculty members at Ball State's School of Music. Composers from New York to California and Hawaii attended the conference.

Since 1971, Molineux has published more than a dozen original compositions. In addition, he has received numerous commissions including one from the Florida Music Teachers Association.

Molineux joined the Chipola music faculty in 1988, where he teaches instrumental music and music theory, and directs the Chipola Rock and Jazz Ensemble. He previously taught instrumental music, theory, and composition at Barton College, and has taught music in public schools in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

He earned a Bachelor's Degree from DePauw University, a Master's Degree from the Eastman School of Music at the University of Rochester and a Doctorate from Florida State University.

The Lady Indians improved to 5-6 in the conference with a 71-63 win at North Florida on Feb. 14. D'Leisha Cockerham led Chipola with 21. Satoya Spates scored 17. The team suffered a narrow 88-85 loss at Tallahassee on Feb. 10. Cockerham led with 25 points. Kamika Collins had 19. Tasha Mathis scored 14. Spates added 12.

The Lady Indians suffered an 89-79 loss to OW on Feb. 7. Barnes led with 16. Varney had 13. Chipola whipped the Lady Pirates of PJC 70-65 on Feb. 3. Barnes

led again with 17. Takesha Oden had 15. Varney added 11. Head coach Jason Keene says, "Basically, we're in a position where we have to win three out of four to make the tournament or force a playoff. We can lose to Gulf Coast, but then we'll have to win all three of our last games. The women's league standings as of Feb. 15: GCCC 11-0; TCC 7-4; OW 8-4; CJC 5-6; and PJC 3-8. The top three teams make the state tournament.

The Indians slipped to 4-4 in the league af-

ter an 80-73 loss at Tallahassee on Feb. 10. Lavelle Felton led Chipola with 23 points. Janerio Spurlock was ejected from the game after receiving two technical fouls. Rules require him to sit out the Gulf Coast game on Feb. 17.

The Indians scored a big 83-79 overtime win over OW on Feb. 7. Michael Wilder led the Indians with 30 points. Felton had 22 and Spurlock added 14. Head coach Ryan Cross says, "The OW game was a huge win for us. It was a game we really needed to win. Our kids really responded

well." Chipola lost a tough-fought game to PJC on Feb. 3 by the score of 69-65.

The men's conference is shaping up to be a four-team battle for the top two spots. The standings as of Feb. 15

are: TCC 8-1; OW 6-3; CJC 4-4; PJC 4-5; and GCCC 0-9. The top two teams in the men's conference earn a spot in the state tournament, March 7-10 at Chipola.

Chipola hosts Tallahassee in the final game of the season on Monday, Feb. 26 for Holmes and Washington Counties Appreciation Night. CJC president Dr. Dale O'Daniel invites all residents of both counties to attend the games free of charge.

The Chipola baseball hosts Lake City CC on Tuesday, Feb. 20, at 2 p.m. The Indians host Mississippi Gulf Coast on Saturday, Feb. 17 at 3 p.m., and travel to Southern Union on Feb. 18.

The Indians are out to a 9-2 start (as of Feb. 15) after splitting a pair at Darton College on Feb. 14. Chipola won the first game, 5-2. Starting pitcher Troy Fry (1-0) picked up the win for CJC. He struck out five in five innings and allowed two runs on three hits. Justin Beck earned his first save with two strikeouts in the final two innings. He allowed two walks and one run on two hits.

Jose Bautista led Chipola's offense with a solo homer in the sixth. Ivan Naccarata had a double.

Chipola had a tough time in game two, losing to Darton 12-4. Chipola starter Blake Balkcom gave up five runs and struck out three in one and one third innings. Chad Coffee allowed seven runs in one and two-thirds innings. Jason McIntyre al-

lowed one hit in the last three innings.

Balkcom led CJC at the plate with a triple. Scott Wearne was two for three with a double and an RBI. Bautista also had a double. Chipola swept Darton 16-3 and 8-7 on Feb. 3 at home.

The Lady Indians Softball team improved to 7-1 after sweeping a pair from Jeff Davis on Feb. 13. Tanya Teague struck out nine and allowed just one run to give Chipola the 4-0 win in game one. Stevie Gray struck out seven batters in six innings to lead Chipola to a 10-2 win in game two. On offense for Chipola, Sammy Wilkes who was two for three; Virginia Spencer two for three and Shanna Sellers had two RBI's on a double in game two. The Lady Indians host Enterprise State on Saturday, Feb. 17.

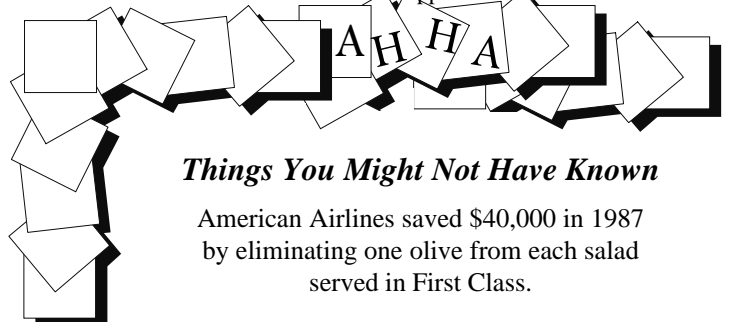
