Chipola hosts Tallahassee on Wednesday

Chipola hosts Tallahassee in a pair of games on Wednesday, Jan. 24, in the Milton H. Johnson Health Center. The women play at 5:30, followed by the men at 7:30. Both CJC squads travel to Okaloosa-Walton on Saturday, Jan. 20. Men's games are broadcast by Clint Cox and Russell Register on WJAQ (100.9).

The Indians—third in the state and 20 in the national poll—are off to a great start with a 2-0 league record and an 18-2 overall mark.

Chipola slipped by Pensacola 95-93 on Jan. 17, battling back from a 19-point halftime deficit. Janerio Spurlock made two big free throws to give CJC the lead with less than one second left in the game. Michael Wilder led Chipola with 23. Lavelle Felton scored 20. Spurlock hit 18. John Andrews contributed 15, and Kareem Johnson added 10.

The Indians won their conference

opener at Gulf Coast on Jan. 13, slipping by the Commodores 103-97 in overtime. Wilder led all scorers with 29 points, followed by Spurlock with 28. Andrews scored 16. Felton and Wayne Bransom each had 14.

Michael Wilder was named Honorable Mention Player for the Week of Jan. 8-15. He averaged 26 points, four rebounds, three assists and two steals in CJC's wins over Santa Fe and Gulf Coast. He is the state's ninth-leading scorer with

a 19.8 average, and twelfth in steals with 44 total.

Several Indians also are among the state's top players. Spurlock is the state's third leading scorer with 22.3 points per game. Felton is number 14 in scoring with a 17.2 average, seventh in free throw percentage with a .848 average, and ninth in assists with a 5.5 average. Kareem Johnson

leads the state in field goal percentage with a .776 average, and is the state's eighth-best rebounder with an 8.4 average. Lance Buoncristiani is sixth in assists with a 6.2 per game average.

The Lady Indians improved to 2-1 in the league and 11-7 overall with a 65-52 win over the Lady Pirates on Jan. 17. DLiesha Cockerham led Chipola with 13 points. Temecca Barnes had 11. Sowo Varney scored 10. Barnes also led Chipola's defensive effort, holding PJC's Kim Moore—the

state's second leading scorer—to only 14 points. The Lady Indians scored an 85-72 win at North Florida on Jan. 10, but suffered a 76-46 misfire at Gulf Coast on Jan. 13.

Several Lady Indians are among the state's top performers. Spates is number 19 in scoring with a 14.24 average. Barnes is third in steals with a 4.35 average, and eighth in assists with a 3.88 average. Chipola received votes for the state's top 10, which is led by Gulf Coast.

Chipola signs top baseball players

Chipola Junior College recently signed four of the nation's top baseball prospects to scholarships for next season. All four are listed among the top 100 high school players by the Team One Baseball Recruiting Service.

Kellen Ludwig is a right-handed pitcher and catcher from Lee County High School in Leesburg, GA. The 6'4, 230 pound senior throws in the 87-93 mph range. He recently competed with Team USA high school players in Australia.

Clay Wehner is a catcher and right-handed pitcher from Thomasville, GA. The 6'1, 210 pound pitcher throws 90-91 mph, and is a top-rated hitter.

Chad Farr is a left-handed pitcher and first baseman from Christian Brothers High School in Memphis, one of the top baseball schools in Tennessee. He throws 93 mph from the left side and has great power with the bat.

TJ Large is a right-handed pitcher from Seminole High School in St. Petersburg. He throws 87-90 mph range. Seminole is the number one ranked high school team in America. Large's Seminole teammate, Casey Kotchman, is son of former CJC player Tom Kotchman, a pro baseball scout.

CJC head coach Jeff Johnson reports that all four players will likely get offers in the upcoming professional baseball draft.

Spooner tapped as Phi Theta Kappa Faculty Scholar

Joseph "Jody" Spooner, an instructor of English at Chipola Junior College, has been selected as a Faculty Scholar for the 2001 Phi Theta Kappa Faculty Scholar Conference and 2001 Phi Theta Kappa Honors Institute.

Applicants must be Phi Theta Kappa advisors who demonstrate exceptional knowledge of the current Honors Study Topic, "Customs, Traditions and Celebrations: The Human Drive for Community," as well as academic excellence.

The Faculty Scholar Conference, sponsored in part by the National Endowment for the Humanities, will be held at Phi Theta Kappa's Center for Excellence in Jackson, Mississippi, February 1-4. The conference serves as preparation for the Faculty Scholars to serve as group facilitators at the Phi Theta Kappa Honors Institute. Faculty Scholars will hear presentations on a variety of issues

concerning community and participate in discussion groups throughout the four-day conference. They will also read recommended materials and prepare annotated bibliographies.

The 34th annual Honors Institute will be held at the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta, June 17-24. During this conference, Spooner and the other Phi Theta Kappa Faculty Scholars will each lead 12-15 honor students in seminar discussions of the issues presented throughout the week.

Phi Theta Kappa, founded in 1918, serves 1,200 two-year colleges around the world. The Society's operations are global in scope with chapters located in all 50 United States, U.S. Territories, Canada, Germany and Japan. Nearly 1.5 million students have earned membership in Phi Theta Kappa since its founding, with more than 80,000 students inducted each year.

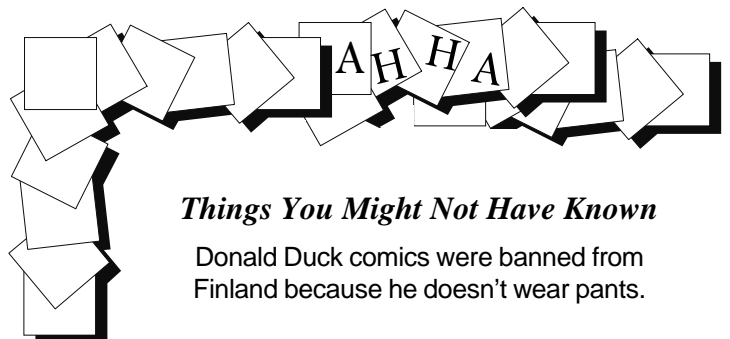
